This being the date and hour to which the Tuscaloosa County Commission adjourned, the County Commission met pursuant to such adjournment with Probate Judge W. Hardy McCollum presiding as Chairman. The following members were present:

Chairman W. Hardy McCollum read into the record and presented to Mr. Dennis Duncan a proclamation proclaiming February 2016, as "CAREER AND TECHNICAL EDUCATION MONTH."

Commissioner Reginald Murray moved, seconded by Commissioner Jerry Tingle, the County Commission voted unanimously to adopt a resolution accepting the streets and drainage structures located in the dedicated street rights-of-way of the Magnolia Forest subdivision for maintenance by the Tuscaloosa County Engineering Department.

Commissioner Reginald Murray moved, seconded by Commissioner Jerry Tingle, the County Commission voted unanimously to approve the warrants issued to cover Tuscaloosa County's expenditures for December 2015.

Commissioner Stan Acker moved, seconded by Commissioner Jerry Tingle, the County Commission voted unanimously to depart from the order of business set forth in the official agenda to discuss the renewal of the psychiatric services contract for the County Jail.

Commissioner Stan Acker moved, seconded by Commissioner Reginald Murray, the County Commission voted unanimously to authorize Chairman W. Hardy McCollum and Sheriff Ron Abernathy to negotiate with the Capstone Health Services Foundation for the psychiatric services for inmates at the Tuscaloosa County Jail and to execute the contract. The current contract is set to expire January 31, 2016.

Commissioner Stan Acker moved, seconded by Commissioner Reginald Murray, the County Commission voted unanimously to approve an evaluation of the unoccupied Community Corrections building located on 35<sup>th</sup> Avenue for use by the Metro Animal Shelter.

Commissioner Jerry Tingle motion's to approve and allow Mercedes International to install directional signs on Will Walker Road and M Class Boulevard as part of a signage project passed with a unanimous vote.

Commissioner Reginald Murray moved, seconded by Commissioner Jerry Tingle, the County Commission voted unanimously to authorize County Attorney Robert Spence to research the legal issues related to County residents connecting onto city sewer systems.

There being no further business to come before the Tuscaloosa County Commission, the meeting adjourned to Wednesday, February 3, 2016.
