This being the date and hour to which the Tuscaloosa County Commission adjourned, the County Commission met pursuant to such adjournment with Probate Judge W. Hardy McCollum presiding as Chairman. The following members were present:

Probate Judge W. Hardy McCollum presented a 25-year service pin to Captain Loyd Baker of the Sheriff's Office and thanked him for his dedicated service to Tuscaloosa County.

Commissioner Bobby Miller moved, seconded by Commissioner Don Wallace, the County Commission voted unanimously to award the bid for purchase of a new track-type hydraulic excavator to Warrior Tractor and Equipment in the amount of \$225,500.00 and accept the individual bid of Deanco Auction Company for the burned track hydraulic excavator in the amount of \$23,500.00.

Commissioner Gary Youngblood moved, seconded by Commissioner Bobby Miller, the County Commission voted unanimously to participate in the Emergency Watershed Protection Program sponsored by the Natural Resources Conservations Service for the removal of storm debris from specific creeks in Tuscaloosa County. The total estimated project cost is \$648,515.00. (Program funding is 90% federal/10% local - county share \$64,852.00)

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AUTHORIZATION OF LEGAL ACTION TO FACILITATE DEBRIS REMOVAL FROM PRIVATE PROPERTY

WHEREAS, on April 15, 2011, and again on April 27, 2011, the residents of Tuscaloosa County suffered catastrophic damage from a series of tornadoes which struck Alabama; and

WHEREAS, the tornadoes which struck Tuscaloosa County on April 27, 2011, caused severe damage to both public and private property and infrastructure, and resulted in a significant loss of life; and

WHEREAS, the Governor of the State of Alabama and the President of the United States have both issued emergency declarations for Tuscaloosa County, and the Tuscaloosa County Commission has declared an emergency for the areas affected by the storms; and

WHEREAS, Tuscaloosa County has requested the assistance of the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) in the removal of debris from private property.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE TUSCALOOSA COUNTY COMMISSION, that the County Attorney is authorized to pursue any legal remedies that will aid in the removal of debris from the affected areas, including the filing of suits to abate the nuisance caused by the debris being allowed to remain on the property, or condemnation through the use of eminent domain if it becomes necessary to acquire rights-of-way to facilitate the abatement of the nuisance. The Commission finds that it is in the public interest and serves a public purpose to have debris removed from private property in order to protect and preserve property or public health and safety, and to ensure the economic recovery of the community.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the Tuscaloosa County Commission has caused this Resolution to be executed in its name and on its behalf by its Chairman on this the 6th day of July, 2011.
