This being the date and hour to which the Tuscaloosa County Commission adjourned, the County Commission met pursuant to such adjournment with Probate Judge W. Hardy McCollum presiding as Chairman. The following members were present:

Commissioner Don Wallace's motion to authorize payment of invoices to Burk-Kleinpeter for engineering design services on the following bridge replacement projects was seconded by Commissioner Gary Youngblood, and the motion passed on a three-to-one vote, with Commissioner Reginald Murray casting the "NAY" vote.
