This being the date and hour to which the Tuscaloosa County Commission adjourned, the County Commission met pursuant to such adjournment with Probate Judge W. Hardy McCollum presiding as Chairman. The following members were present:

Commissioner Jerry Tingle moved, seconded by Commissioner Stan Acker, the County Commission voted unanimously to authorize payment of invoices to Coaling Water Authority and Carroll's Creek Water Authority for the following water main replacements:

Bridge replacement project on Hargrove Road over Lye Branch
\$4,600.00

Bridge replacement project on Old Jasper Road over Gin
Branch \$3,448.00

Commissioner Jerry Tingle moved, seconded by Commissioner Stan Acker, the County Commission voted unanimously to approve a request from Logan Real Estate Holdings, LLC for the following bond extensions in the Lake View area:

Commissioner Stan Acker moved, seconded by Commissioner Jerry Tingle, the County Commission voted unanimously to authorize negotiations with property owners for purchase of right-of-way for the following state funded projects: Moccasin Branch Road and Dobbs Road.

Commissioner Bobby Miller moved, seconded by Commissioner Stan Acker, the County Commission voted unanimously to declare the following trailer surplus property and authorize the disposal:

Commissioner Bobby Miller moved, seconded by Commissioner Reginald Murray, the County Commission voted unanimously to adopt a resolution authorizing submission of a grant application package to Alabama Department of Transportation (ALDOT), for construction of a walking trail focused on accessibility for handicapped persons which will begin at Hinton Place Subdivision and continue to the Miller Center. The Commission previously approved a trail at the Bobby Miller Center to be submitted to the Alabama Department of Transportation (ALDOT), under a different grant program. Also included was an application to Alabama Department of Economic and Community Affairs (ADECA), for construction of a walking trail at the Miller Center which will request up to \$100,000.00 in grant funds, plus a 20% match which will be provided from District Development funds.

The County Commission voted unanimously to approve the warrants issued to cover Tuscaloosa County's expenditures for April 2013.

Commissioner Stan Acker moved, seconded by Commissioner Jerry Tingle, the County Commission voted unanimously to adopt a resolution authorizing the vacation of a right-of-way of a portion of Little Yellow Lane. The sole owner of the property is Alawest-AL, LLC and is the petitioner. It was noted by County Attorney Robert Spence that a public hearing was held this date and no persons were in attendance to object.

Commissioner Reginald Murray moved, seconded by Commissioner Bobby Miller, the County Commission voted unanimously to go into Executive Session prior to the end of this meeting to discuss two matters of pending litigation.

Commissioner Bobby Miller moved, seconded by Commissioner Stan Acker, the County Commission voted unanimously to award the bid for Prescription Drugs, Non-Prescription Drugs and Supplies for the Tuscaloosa County Jail to I.H.S. Pharmacy as the low bidder meeting all specifications. The bids were opened April 18, 2013. (Bid invitation, responding bidders and pharmaceutical bid summary attached).

Commissioner Stan Acker's motion to approve the City-County Facility Upgrades Four Year Plan - B1 was seconded by Commissioner Reginald Murray. After discussion, Commissioner Bobby Miller made a motion to table. The motion to table failed on a three-to-one vote with Commissioners' Acker, Tingle and Murray casting the nay votes. After further discussion, Commissioner Jerry Tingle moved, seconded by Commissioner Stan Acker, to amend the original motion to combine items 12 and 13 into one, (for a line item total of \$2,600,000.00). The motion to amend passed on a three-to-one vote with Commissioner Bobby Miller casting the nay vote.

Commissioner Jerry Tingle's motion to adopt the Speed Table Policy, was seconded by Commissioner Stan Acker. After discussion, Commissioner Bobby Miller made a motion to amend to accept Districts' I, II and IV and exclude District III. The motion to amend was not accepted. The vote was taken on the original motion and passed on a three-to-one vote with Commissioner Bobby Miller casting the nay vote.

Commissioner Bobby Miller moved, seconded by Commissioner Jerry Tingle, the County Commission voted unanimously to authorize the Engineering Department to post the following signage on Indian Creek Cut-Off Road; Speed Limit 35 MPH and No Trucks.

Commissioner Bobby Miller's motion to offer Buddy Tillery \$850,000.00 for purchase of his chert pit failed for lack of a second. After discussion, Commissioner Jerry Tingle moved, seconded by Commissioner Bobby Miller, the County Commission voted unanimously to authorize Bobby Hagler, Melvin Vines and Robert Spence to


negotiate a contract for purchase of the chert pit and to present to the Commission for approval.



There being no further business to come before the Tuscaloosa County Commission, the meeting adjourned to Wednesday, May 29, 2013.






WHEREAS, the Tuscaloosa County Commission is eligible for grant funding up to \$100,000 with a match requirement of 20% for the above said project;







THAT the party desires to vacate a portion of the Little Yellow Lane Road, a public road, as provided in §23-4-20 of the Code of Alabama, 1975; and



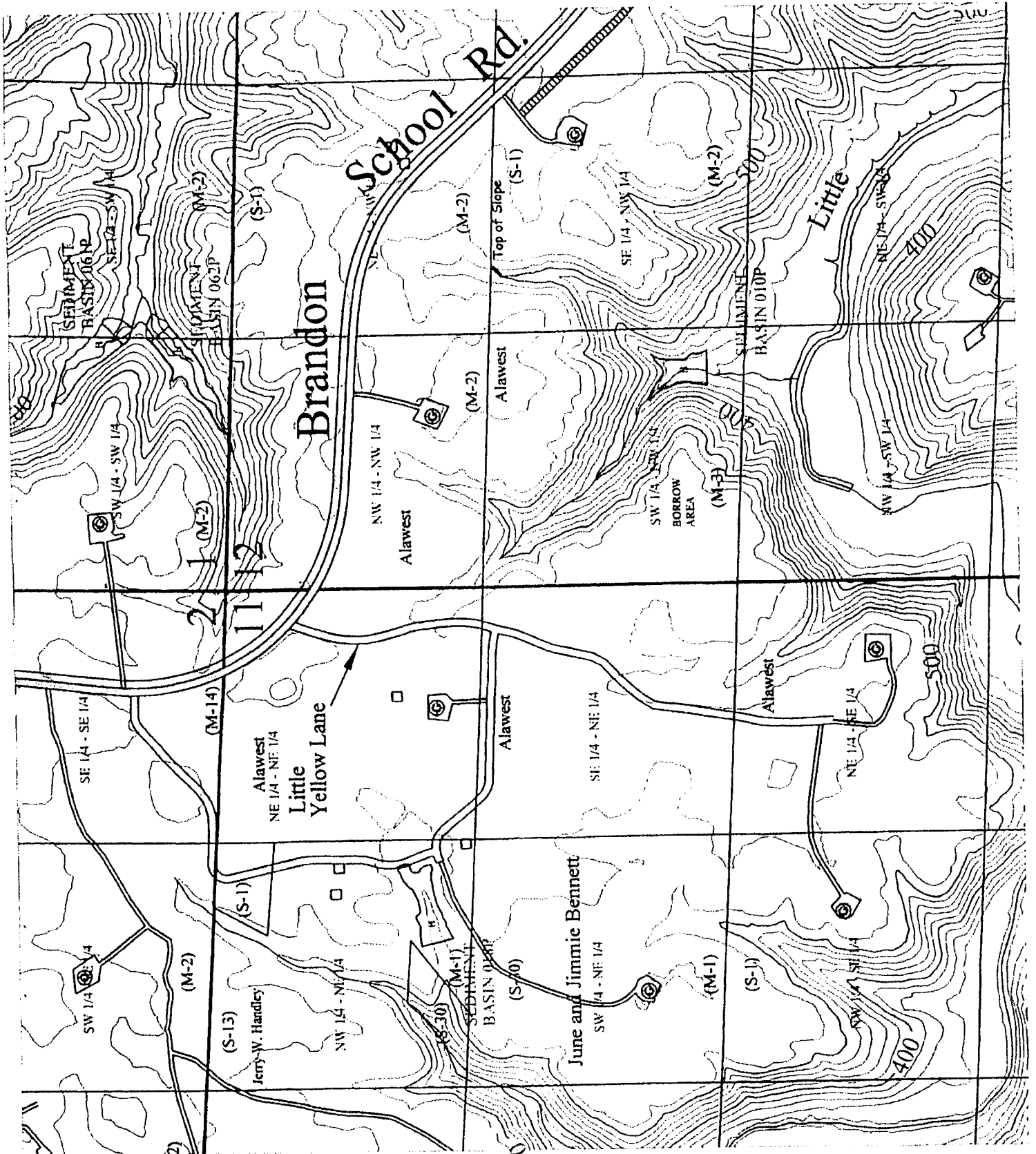

1. The Tuscaloosa County Sheriff's Office, solicits an agreement for the purchase of prescriptions, non-prescription drugs and supplies. The award of this proposal will be on an AWP plus dollar amount for prescription drugs and AWP plus percentage on all other non-prescription drugs and supplies. Billing will be checked for correct AWP by using area wholesale current catalogs such as Medisense and Burgen & Brunswick. Sheriff's Office reserves the right to request current average wholesale pricing information upon demand. The bid shall specify which current catalog price is used for this proposal/bid.
2. If patient is on Alacaid or any other third party prepaid prescription program there will be no charge other than what the insurance plan reimburses the vendor. There will be no additional cost to the Tuscaloosa County Sheriff's Office for packaging calendar / blister pack drugs.
3. It is the intention of the Tuscaloosa County Sheriff's Office to award this contract for a period of not less than three (3) years from the date of the award of the contract. DCH is currently registered as a disproportionate share hospital, which enables them to obtain 340b pharmaceutical pricing through the disproportionate status. 340b is the lowest possible pricing for pharmaceuticals and traditionally averages 25-30% lower than actual wholesale cost. If Tuscaloosa County Jail chooses CSP as their pharmacy partner, CSP will determine whether or not 340b can be implemented and, if so, walk with Tuscaloosa County through the process to dramatically reduce medication costs.

B) According to the Q&A, Tuscaloosa County Jail does not currently utilize an EMAR (Electronic Medication Administration Record). If Tuscaloosa County is interested in a deploying an EMAR, CSP has extensive experience in EMAR implementation.

C) According to the Q&A, Tuscaloosa County Jail currently utilizes I H S Pharmacy out of Rainsville, Alabama. Since the Alabama Board of Pharmacy does not allow medications to be returned, CSP will be able to circumvent that restriction as a Nashville, Tennessee pharmacy. CSP is allowed to accept returns for credit as long as the medication is packed as a single dose, which is why it is our recommendation that high dollar medication (i.e. HIV) be packed with one (1) pill per bag to allow for maximum credit on medication returns.

The following is a complete summary of the bid proposals presented to this office followed with recommendation as to the award of said contract:

Sheriff's Office reserves the right to request current average wholesale pricing information upon demand. The bid shall specify which current catalog price is used for this proposal/bid".

Based on the Proposal received from Walgreens Pharmacy the "Usual & Customary" answers given for the AWP and Medical Supplies and the lack of information provided in the area of reports it is my recommendation that this proposal from Walgreens Pharmacy be rejected.

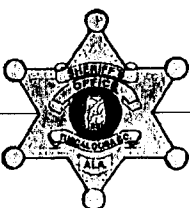

While WellDyne Rx is comparable with two other proposals with prescription AWP being minus 21% the other fees associated with this proposal will more than take care of the 1% saved with going with this proposal. There were a total of 19,033 prescriptions written from this facility in 2012. With the cost of \$6.50 per prescription there would be an additional cost of \$123,714.50 with just the minimum per prescription fee. Based on the extra fees associated with this proposal the Tuscaloosa County Commission pharmaceutical costs would greatly increase. It is therefore my recommendation that the proposal submitted by WellDyne Rx be rejected.

Based on the AWP of minus 18.5%, which is a difference of 1.5% to 2.0% from the top two proposals, and the higher Plus Cost on Medical supplies it is my recommendation that the proposal submitted by Diamond Pharmaceuticals be rejected.

While Contract Pharmacy Services has put together a comparable and competitive bid, it is the my opinion that any Medical supplies purchased from CPS would negate the 1% savings when compared to IHS AWP Cost - 20%. There was a total of \$253,040 spend in 2012 on pharmaceuticals through IHS pharmacy. A 1% difference in this cost would total \$2,530.00. Also CPS lists Non-Prescription AWP -21% which is lower than IHS AWP -30%. Based on the differences between CPS and IHS on the non-prescription and medical supplies AWP, it is my recommendation that the proposal submitted by Contract Pharmacy Services be rejected.

When comparing the differences in the proposals between Contract Pharmacy Services (CPS) and IHS Pharmacy there are some differences. While CPS offers a Prescription AWP -21%, a 1% difference from IHS Pharmacy, it also lists an AWP of -90% for Generic Multiple Source medications. Although the bid specs make no mention regarding "Generic Multiple Source Medications" I contacted Mr. Sanderson regarding this. Mr. Sanderson stated that IHS Pharmacy on Multi-Source Medications finds the company that sells the appropriate generic medication at the lowest cost. Other differences between the two include the AWP -30% on Non-Prescription Medications and Medical Supplies. IHS is offering the better percentage on both these items.



While there would be a savings of approximately \$2,530.00 with CPS with an AWP of -21% on Prescription Medications when compared to the costs of 2012 it is my opinion that the AWP -30% in Non-Prescription medications and AWP -30% on Medical Supplies compared with CPS AWP -21% on Non-Prescription and Cost + 10% on Medical Supplies would more than make up any differences between the two companies. It is therefore my recommendation, based on the AWP comparison across the board, that IHS Pharmacy has the better percentages and be awarded the Contract for Pharmaceutical Services for the Tuscaloosa County Jail.

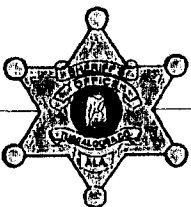

Speed Table Policy

Speed Table Requests

Tuscaloosa County residents sometimes request speed tables on streets in their neighborhood. Tuscaloosa County provides speed tables as a community service.

Residents with concerns about excessive speeding and interested in speed tables may request the Tuscaloosa County Engineering Department to investigate the speeding concern and to make recommendations to address the speeding concern. These recommendations should include options of traffic engineering improvements, speed limit enforcement and traffic calming measures. Requests for the speed table guidelines and standard petition form should be made to the office of the Tuscaloosa County Engineer at 205-345-6600.

Purpose of Speed Tables

Speed tables are used to control speeds on residential streets. Engineers have found that speed tables can lower the 85th percentile speeds on residential streets to within a range between the speed limit and five miles per hour above the speed limit.

Speed Table Dimensions

Tuscaloosa County's Type I speed table is three inches high, and are 10.5 feet long. Type II speed tables are similar but are 14 feet long and are applied on qualifying streets with posted speed limits above 25 MPH.

Petitioning for Speed Tables

Petitions are considered complete only when they are signed by the property owners representing at least 60% of the residential units on the affected section of the road as well as the property owners along the connecting side streets within the affected area. Only one signature per parcel of property will be counted. The affected area for each speed table request will be designated by the County Engineer. The address of each property owner signing the petition must be included on the petition. The requestor who collects signatures on the petition must be listed at the top of the document including home address and telephone number. The petition must be submitted to the Tuscaloosa County Engineering Department for review.

Identifying Speed Table Location

The requestor must identify the location for the table being requested by providing the nearest physical address to the speed table being requested.

Approving or Denying Petitions

Upon receipt of the petition the Tuscaloosa County Engineering Department will review it and conduct a study of the affected area. If the findings show that speed tables are justified and feasible, then the engineering study and agency concerns will be forwarded to the County Commission for approval. If the petition is denied the requestor will receive information on why it was denied. If the petition is approved, each person that signed the petition will be notified by mail that the speed table will be installed.

When the initial request for a Speed Table is received, a log, including all contact information of the petitioner and correspondence, shall be maintained in the office of the

Tuscaloosa County Engineering Department. A packet including all requirements, a blank petition form and a self addressed return envelope shall be mailed to the requestor.

Upon receipt of the completed petition a copy is to be forwarded to the Inspecting Engineer. When the Engineering Study is complete, Commissioners shall be notified of the results of the study "Approving or Denying" the request two weeks before a letter is mailed to a requestor. Commissioners may elect to have a Speed Table installed or removed without going through this process.

Speed Tables are generally not installed at locations where:

- The 85th percentile speed exceeds the speed limit by less than 5 miles per hour
- Traffic volume is less than 100 vehicles per day
- Traffic volume is greater than 300 vehicles per day
- The road is less than 1000 feet long
- The roadway is a designated collector or arterial street
- The roadway is on a designated public transit bus route
- The roadway lacks straight sections for adequate sight distance for recognition and reaction to the speed table
- The roadway has grades in excess of 6%
- Frequent driveway openings exist
- Posted speed limits are more than 30 miles per hour
- Less than 60% of the residents in the affected area support the proposal
- Location is less than 200 feet from an intersection
- Another speed table is less than 500 feet away on the same road

Based on the factors listed above, the Tuscaloosa County Engineering Department will complete a comprehensive review within three months. If approval is granted and funding is available, speed tables(s) will be installed within 3 months from the date of approval.

Petition for Speed Table Removal

Tuscaloosa County also receives requests for speed table removal. The same procedure for speed table installation petitions is used for removal petitions.
