This being the date and hour to which the Tuscaloosa County Commission adjourned, the County Commission met pursuant to such adjournment with Probate Judge W. Hardy McCollum presiding as Chairman. The following members were present:

Commissioner Bobby Miller moved, seconded by Commissioner Jerry Tingle, the County Commission voted unanimously to adopt a resolution to exempt certain "covered items" from the county sales and use tax during the first full weekend of August, 2013, (August 2-4, 2013), as authorized by Act 2006-574, generally referred to as the State Sales Tax Holiday Legislation.

Commissioner Stan Acker made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Bobby Miller, to go into Executive Session prior to the end of this meeting to discuss Heritage Commission Appointments. After discussion, Commissioner Murray moved to include discussing legal matters. After further discussion, Commissioner Jerry Tingle moved to include discussing any legal matters. Both amendments to the original motion, passed unanimously.

Commissioner Stan Acker moved, seconded by Commissioner Jerry Tingle, the County Commission voted unanimously to reject the City of Tuscaloosa's proposal regarding PARA upgrades, to move forward with "County only projects", (items 14 - 20), and to continue discussions with the City of Tuscaloosa regarding these proposed shared projects in hopes of reaching an amicable agreement.



This program will supplement both the Solid Waste and Clean Streets litter details. The Solid Waste department will administratively support this program and will receive a budget increase of \$15,000.00.

Commissioner Bobby Miller moved, seconded by Commissioner Reginald Murray, the County Commission voted unanimously to reappoint Melvin Vines and Dr. Linda Beito to the Heritage Commission Board. Terms will expire September 30, 2016.

Commissioner Bobby Miller moved, seconded by Commissioner Reginald Murray, the County Commission voted unanimously to appoint Dan Gibson to the Heritage Commission Board. The term will expire May 29, 2017.

Commissioner Jerry Tingle moved, seconded by Commissioner Bobby Miller, the County Commission voted unanimously to rebid construction for the Lake Retreat and Deer Chase water extension projects. The rebids for construction will involve bidding the two extensions utilizing PVC pipe with a bid alternate for ductile iron pipe with Farrington Snipes authorized to contact Cassidy Engineering for preparation of bid documents.


There being no further business to come before the Tuscaloosa County Commission, the meeting adjourned to Wednesday, June 19, 2013.

RESOLUTION TO EXEMPT CERTAIN "COVERED ITEMS" FROM THE COUNTY SALES AND USE TAX DURING THE FIRST FULL WEEKEND OF AUGUST, 2013, AS AUTHORIZED BY ACT 2006-574, GENERALLY REFERRED TO AS THE STATE SALES TAX HOLIDAY LEGISLATION.


WHEREAS, Act 2006-574 enacted by the Alabama Legislature during the 2006 Regular Session, provides for a State Sales Tax Holiday, and provides that counties and municipalities may join with the state in exempting certain items from sales and use taxes; and

WHEREAS, the Tuscaloosa County Commission has determined that it is in the best interest of the citizens of Tuscaloosa County to exempt school supplies from sales and use taxes as provided for by law.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Tuscaloosa County Commission that all "covered items" shall be exempt from any county sales and use tax during the same period, beginning at 12:01 a.m. on the first Friday in August 2013 (August 2, 2013) and ending at twelve midnight the following Sunday (August 4, 2013), subject to all terms, conditions, definitions, time periods, and rules as provided by Act 2006-574, except that the time period shall only be as specified above and not for all years thereafter.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a certified copy of this resolution be immediately forwarded to the Alabama Department of Revenue to be recorded and posted on the Department website.







DAN SHELBY ROAD

GENERAL

Tuscaloosa County will accept sealed bids until Wednesday, May 22, 2013 for earthwork and associated construction of Dan Shelby Road. The purpose of the project is to improve the geometry of the existing road to meet AASHTO standards, and prepare it for paving. The work shall include all items of work described herein and shown on the bid sheet. All work shall be in accordance with the Alabama Department of Transportation Standard Specifications for Highway Construction, 2012 edition (hereafter referred to as Specifications). There shall be no direct payment made or extra compensation for any work performed other than for the items on the bid sheet. It is understood that the Contractor's compensation for any additional work required by the specifications or this bid document will be included in other bid items of work. The contractor shall have a supervisor on the jobsite who is experienced and qualified in the construction of roads. All contractors submitting a bid shall be licensed by the State of Alabama Licensing Board For General Contractors to perform the type of work described within this bid package. The County reserves the right to accept or reject any or all bids, to waive minor discrepancies, or to award individual bid items based on the best overall benefit to the County. There will be no extra compensation or claims allowed due to any decision the County makes in awarding the contract or individual items of the contract. This will supercede the provisions of the standard specifications.

BID BOND

Each bid submission shall be accompanied by a bid bond of the prescribed form made payable to the Tuscaloosa County Commission in the amount of five (5) percent of the Total Bid Amount. Bidder shall submit the Bid Bond using the Bid Bond form attached.

PERFORMANCE BOND

The successful bidder shall, within 10 days after the award of the contract furnish to the County Engineer an acceptable surety bond in the amount equal to 100 percent of the Total Bid Amount. Bidder shall submit the Performance Bond using the Performance Bond form attached.

MOBILIZATION

Mobilization shall be in accordance with Section 600 of the Specifications. There will be no additional compensation for mobilization regardless of the number of times the contractor may have to move off the project. The unit price bid for mobilization shall not exceed 6% of the total bid amount.

EROSION CONTROL

Erosion control items will be established and maintained in accordance with Section 665 of the Specifications. The contractor shall provide an erosion control plan prior to beginning any work. It is a condition of this document that the contractor exercise planning and forethought in coordinating the work of protecting the project and adjoining properties from soil erosion by effective and continuous erosion control methods in accordance with the Specifications. The contractor shall indemnify and hold harmless Tuscaloosa County for damage claims arising from soil erosion on the project.

A Best Management Practices Plan (BMP) is required for this project. The attached certification shall apply and the contractor shall submit for approval any documents he proposes to use other than the documents in the attached certification.

CLEARING AND GRUBBING

Tuscaloosa County will clear and grub areas within the construction limits as well as the borrow pit area.

REMOVAL AND RELOCATION OF STRUCTURES

The relocation of permanent fences and the construction of temporary fences shall be the responsibility of Tuscaloosa County.

Tuscaloosa County will be responsible for supplying and installing all cross drain and side drain culverts. The Contractor shall coordinate his work schedule with the County Engineer regarding culvert installations.

UTILITIES

Tuscaloosa County will notify all utility owners or other parties affected prior to construction beginning. The County will make every effort to have all necessary adjustments of public utilities or other appurtenances within or adjacent to construction limits made as soon as practicable. The owners or operators of public utilities shall have access to the work for the installation, adjustment, or repair of main line and service facilities. The Contractor shall coordinate his activities with those of utility owners while utility adjustments are being made. The Contractor shall investigate conditions of existing utilities prior to submitting his bid for the purpose of coordinating the work to the greatest extent possible. It shall be the Contractor's responsibility to determine the exact location of all existing utilities.

EARTHWORK

The entire roadway within the limits of the project shall be constructed to the roadway template and dimensions provided by the County Engineer or his representative. Construction shall conform to the requirements set forth in Section 200 of the Alabama Department of Transportation Standard Specifications for Highway Construction, 2012 edition (hereafter referred to as Specifications) except as herein modified. Embankment shall be placed in reasonable uniform layers not exceeding eight (8) inches (loose measurement) and, insofar as practical, the full width of the embankment section. Each layer shall be compacted as specified before the next overlying layer is placed. Care shall be taken during the compaction operations so that uniform density is obtained. Compaction tests shall be performed in accordance with Section 210.03(d)3. of the Specifications. The contractor shall be responsible for contacting the Tuscaloosa County Engineer's office to request compaction test. Notification shall be made at least 48 hours in advance.

The dumping operation shall be limited to the amount of materials that can be placed, shaped, and compacted by the end of the working day. No deviation from the above will be allowed without written permission of the Engineer.

CONSTRUCTION STAKES, LINES, AND GRADES

Tuscaloosa County shall provide the staking of the right-of-way and construction along the project. The Engineer on project will provide grades. A typical roadway cross section is enclosed. Superelevation shall be placed in the curves in accordance with AASHTO standards.

MAILBOXES

Mailboxes within the limits of operations shall be removed by the Contractor before work is begun and set temporarily where they will be accessible both to the mail carrier and the patron. As soon as the state of the work permits and the Engineer directs, all mail boxes shall be reset by the Contractor in permanent locations in compliance with Postal Regulations. Mail boxes or supports that have been damaged by the Contractor shall be replaced at his expense in accordance with Postal Regulations. The cost of removing, temporarily resetting, and permanently resetting mail boxes shall be included in the prices bid for the various pay items of work and no direct payment will be made for this work.

MAINTENANCE OF ROADS AND DETOURS

The contractor shall, at his expense, keep the road open to all traffic while performing the required improvements and during the duration of the contract. The Contractor shall keep the portion of the project being used by public traffic, whether it is through or local traffic; in such condition that traffic will be adequately accommodated. He shall provide and maintain in a safe condition temporary approaches or crossings and intersections with trails, roads, streets, businesses, residences, garages, and farms. Where so approved by the Engineer, the Contractor may bypass traffic over an approved detour route.

Upon notification by the County of needed repairs, the Contractor shall perform required repairs without delay; otherwise, the County will perform the repairs and the cost thereof will be deducted from amounts due on the contract. The Contractor shall have employees available 24 hours a day and shall provide the County with a list of contact numbers in the event repairs are required. The Contractor will be allowed 2 hours from the time of contact to begin any required repairs. The Contractor shall indemnify the County from any claims or damages arising due to failure of the Contractor to keep the roads or detours in an open and safe condition for the traveling public.

The contractor shall furnish, erect, and maintain barricades, warning signs, delineators, and flagmen in accordance with Section "VI" of the "Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices".

AGGREGATE TYPE SURFACE

This work shall be in accordance with the requirements in Section 430 of the specifications. The materials used shall be AHD #2 and AHD #5, and shall conform to the requirements in Section 801 of the specifications. The materials to be used will be supplied and stocked on the project by Tuscaloosa County. There will be no cost to the contractor for the materials. The contractor shall spread the materials at the direction of the County Engineer or his representative. There shall be no direct payment made to the contractor for the placement of the material. The cost of placement of the material shall be an incidental cost of the project. It is intended for this material to be used as needed for repairs to the roadway during construction.

SEPARATION GEOTEXTILE

The unit price bid by the contractor shall be payment in full for installing the separation geotextile according to the requirements in Section 608 of the Specifications.

RIP RAP

The unit price bid by the contractor shall be payment in full for installing the rip rap according to the requirements in Section 610 of the Specifications.

PAYMENT

Payment for the earthwork will be made on a per loose cubic yard basis (loose measurement) of material hauled. Payment quantities will be determined by counting the number of loads hauled each day at the manufacturer's rated capacity (heaped) or actual computed capacity as determined by the Engineer for the type of equipment used according to the haul distance. Any load that is not completely full will not be paid for. There will be a daily statement of cubic yards hauled signed by the authorized representative of the Contractor and Tuscaloosa County (See attached form TCP-210). Compaction tests and TCP-210 forms shall be required prior to payment.

The basic bid unit will be on a per cubic yard basis and shall include excavating, hauling, shaping, and compacting material at a haul distance up to and including ½ mile. The contractor shall submit a bid for additional ½ mile overhaul units on a per cubic yard basis. The number of overhaul units exceeding the initial ½ mile base bid will be multiplied by the unit price per ½ mile overhaul unit and added to the base bid to determine the adjusted unit price for any haul distances exceeding the initial ½ mile base bid.

CONSTRUCTION TIME

Work shall commence no later than fifteen calendar (15) days following the date of award by the Tuscaloosa County Commission. The contractor shall schedule a pre-construction conference with the County Engineer's office prior to commencement of work. The contractor will be allowed forty-five (45) working days to complete the work. Request for contract time extensions and/or time suspensions shall be submitted in writing to the County Engineer. The reasons for such extensions and/or suspensions shall be clearly set forth. Failure to complete the work within time stipulated will result in the assessment of liquidated damages in the amount of \$250.00 per working day according to the provisions in section 108.11 of the Specifications.

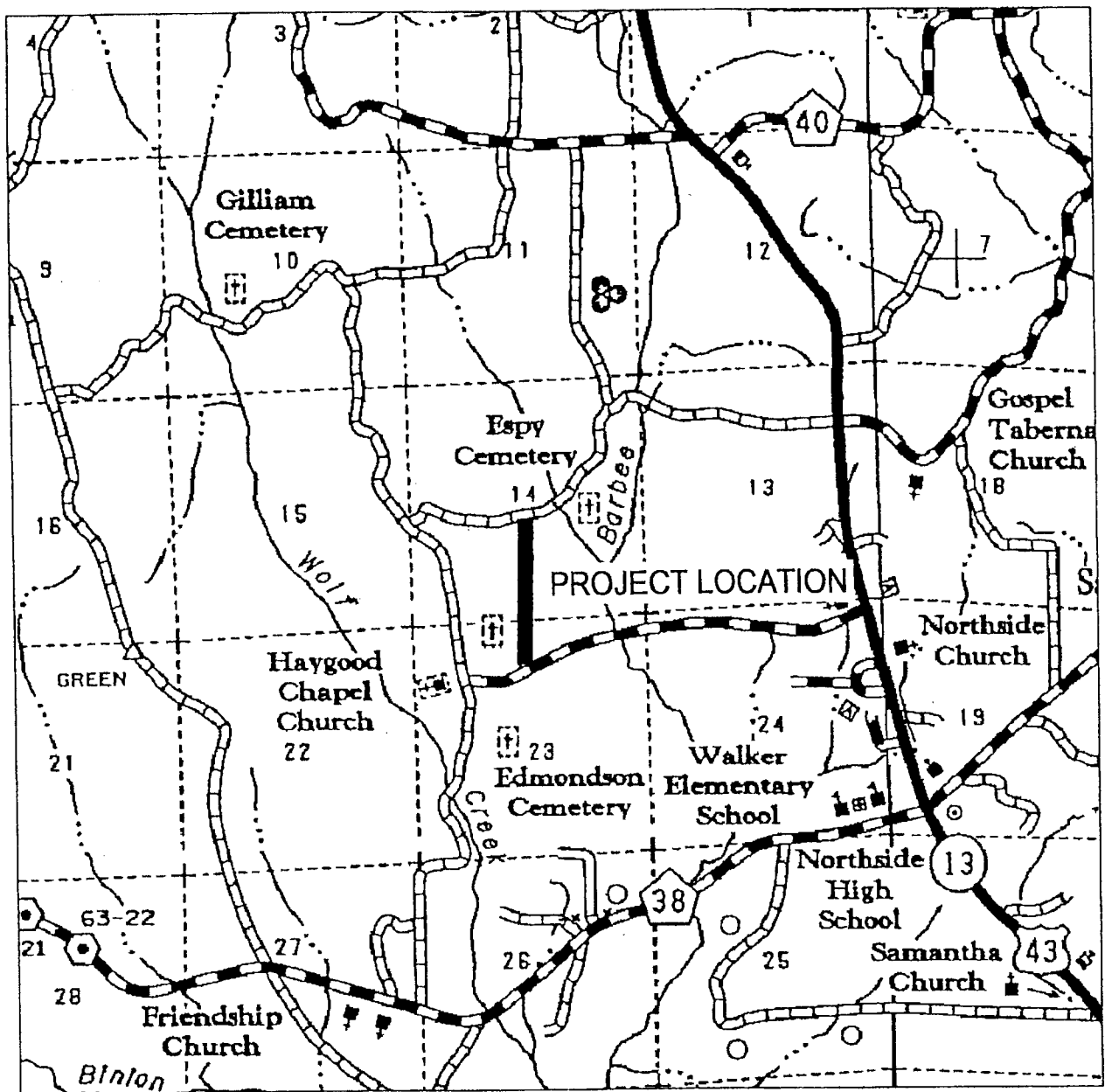

TUSCALOOSA COUNTY, ALABAMA

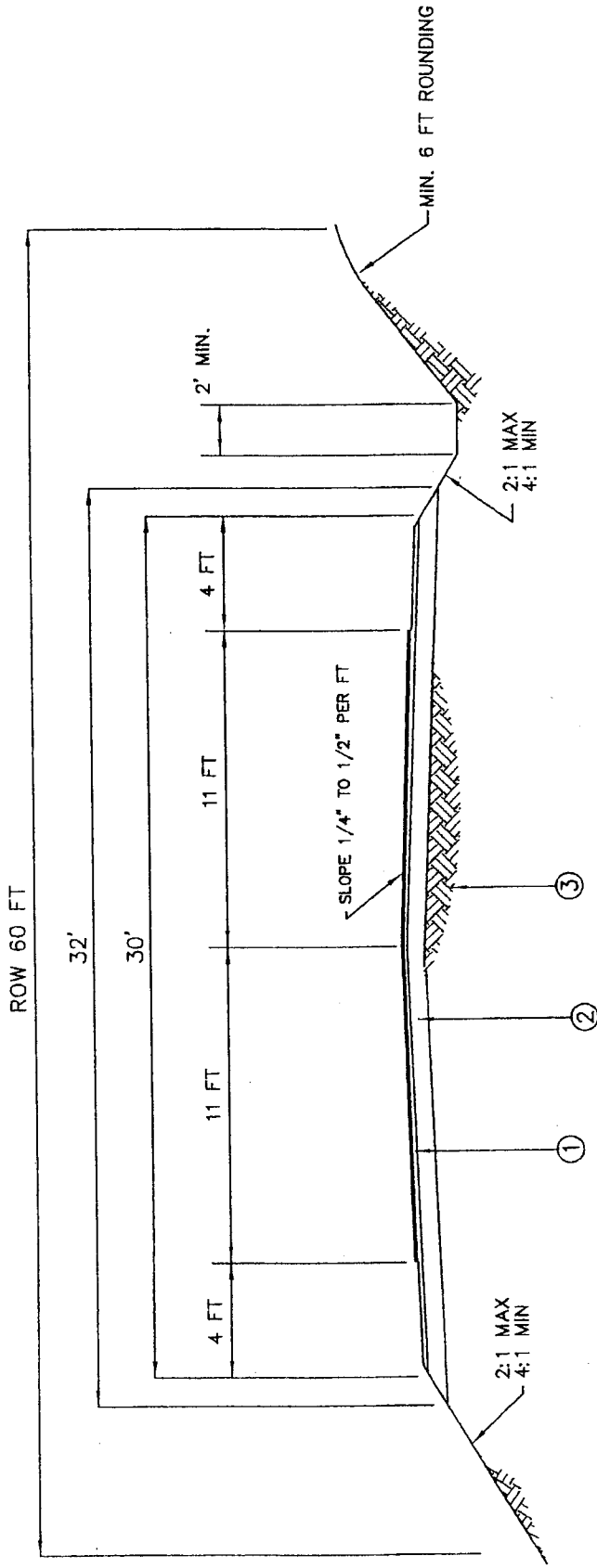

(NORMAL CROWN)

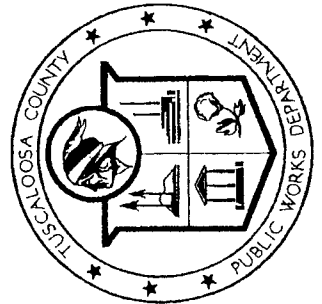





SPRINGER ROAD

GENERAL

Tuscaloosa County will accept sealed bids until Wednesday, May 22, 2013 for base processing on Springer Road. The purpose of the project is to construct the base course on the roadbed for paving. All work shall be in accordance with the Alabama Department of Transportation Standard Specifications for Highway Construction, 2012 edition (hereafter referred to as Specifications). There shall be no direct payment made or extra compensation for any work performed other than for the items on the bid sheet. It is understood that the Contractor's compensation for any additional work required by the specifications or this bid document will be included in other bid items of work. The contractor shall have a supervisor on the jobsite who is experienced and qualified in the construction of roads. All contractors submitting a bid shall be licensed by the State of Alabama Licensing Board for General Contractors to perform the type of work described within this bid package.

BID BOND

Each bid submission shall be accompanied by a bid bond of the prescribed form made payable to the Tuscaloosa County Commission in the amount of five (5) percent of the Total Bid Amount. Bidder shall submit the Bid Bond using the Bid Bond form attached.

PERFORMANCE BOND

The successful bidder shall, within 10 days after the award of the contract shall furnish to the County Engineer an acceptable surety bond in the amount equal to 100 percent of the Total Bid Amount. Bidder shall submit the Performance Bond using the Performance Bond form attached.

BASE WORK

The entire roadway within the limits of the project shall be constructed to the roadway template and dimensions provided by the County Engineer or his representative. Construction shall conform to the requirements set forth in Section 301 of the Alabama Department Of Transportation Standard Specifications for Highway Construction, 2012 edition except as herein modified. Tuscaloosa County will provide the base material. The base will be dumped in sufficient quantities and stockpiled along the centerline of the road. The contractor will be responsible for processing, shaping, and compacting the base material. Care shall be taken during the compaction operations so that uniform density is obtained. Compaction tests shall be performed in accordance with Section 306 of the Specifications. The contractor shall be responsible for contacting the Tuscaloosa County Engineer's office to request compaction tests. Notification shall be made at least 48 hours in advance.

The base processing operation shall be limited to the amount of materials that can be mixed, shaped, and compacted by the end of the working day. No deviation from the above will be allowed without written permission of the Engineer.

AGGREGATE TYPE SURFACE

This work shall be in accordance with the requirements in Section 430 of the specifications. The materials used shall be AHD #2 and AHD #5, and shall conform to the requirements in Section 801 of the specifications. The materials to be used will be supplied and stocked on the project by Tuscaloosa County. There will be no cost to the contractor for the materials. The contractor shall spread the materials at the direction of the County Engineer or his representative. There shall be no direct payment made to the contractor for the placement of the material. The cost of placement of the material shall be an incidental

cost of the project. It is intended for this material to be used as needed for repairs to the roadway during construction.

PRIME

The contractor shall submit a contingency bid for Bituminous Treatment Type "A" (Prime). Tuscaloosa County will perform this work with its own forces if possible. A minimum of twenty four (24) hours advance notice shall be provided by the contractor in order for the County to schedule the work. The notice may not be given until all compaction tests have passed on the section of roadway to be primed. If the County can not schedule the work in a timely manner the Contractor will be authorized to perform the work. As soon as possible after obtaining passing compaction tests the contractor shall contact the County prior to priming the section of roadway and at that point a determination will be made as to whether the Contractor or the County will perform the prime work.

Work shall meet the requirements of Section 401 of the Specifications. Specific attention is directed to Section 401.03(d)4. Special Details. The contractor shall be required to sand the prime and keep the road open to traffic at no extra compensation. The contractor will also be responsible for maintenance and repair of the primed roadway until accepted by the County.

CONSTRUCTION STAKES, LINES, AND GRADES

A typical roadway cross section is enclosed. The contractor shall place super elevation in the curves according to AASHTO standards.

MAINTENANCE OF ROADS AND DETOURS

The contractor shall, at his expense, keep the road open to all traffic while performing the required improvements. The Contractor shall keep the portion of the project being used by public traffic, whether it is through or local traffic; in such condition that traffic will be adequately accommodated. He shall provide and maintain in a safe condition temporary approaches or crossings and intersections with trails, roads, streets, businesses, residences, garages, and farms. Where so approved by the Engineer, the Contractor may bypass traffic over an approved detour route.

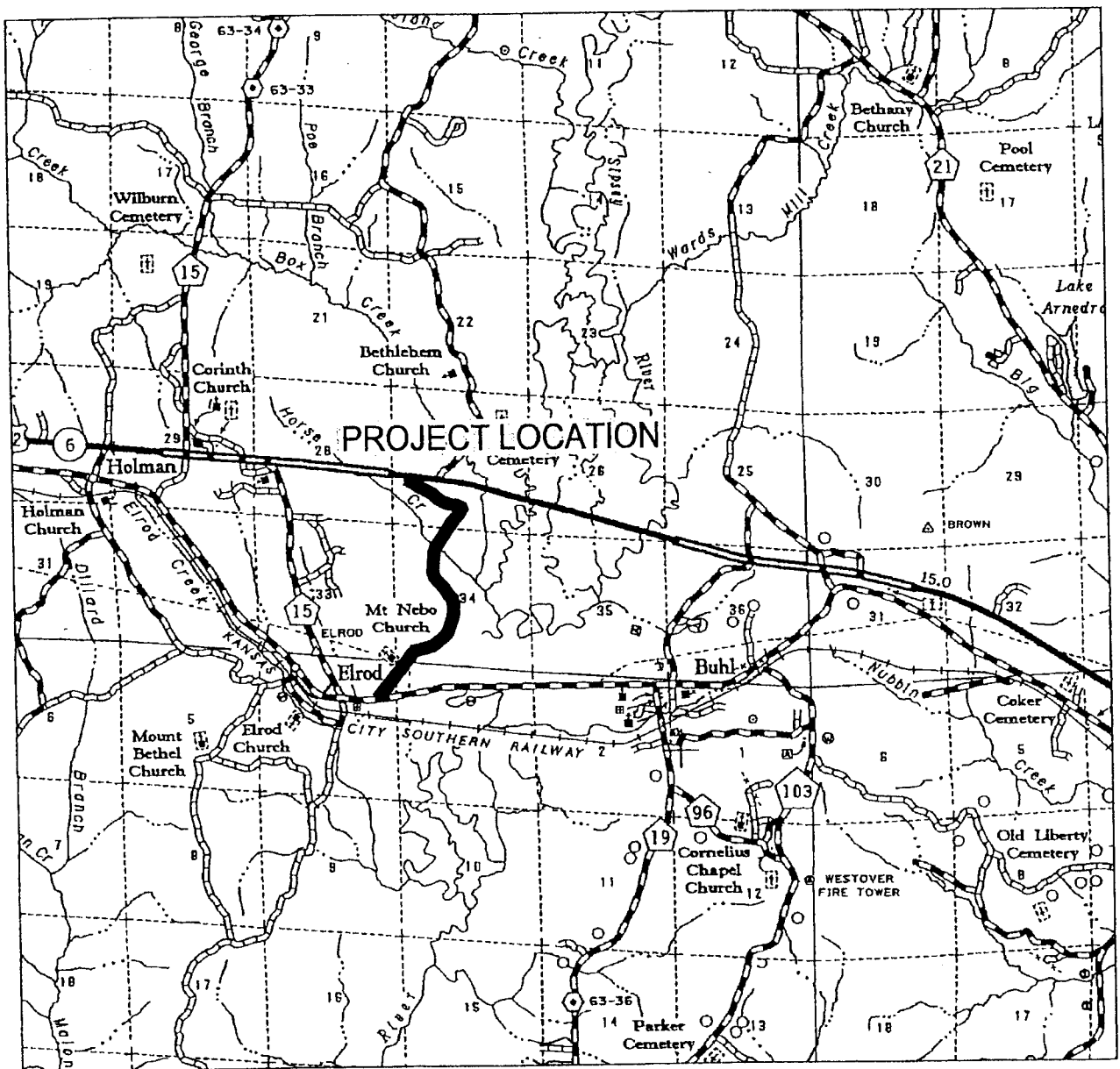
PROJECT LOCATION MAP SPRINGER ROAD

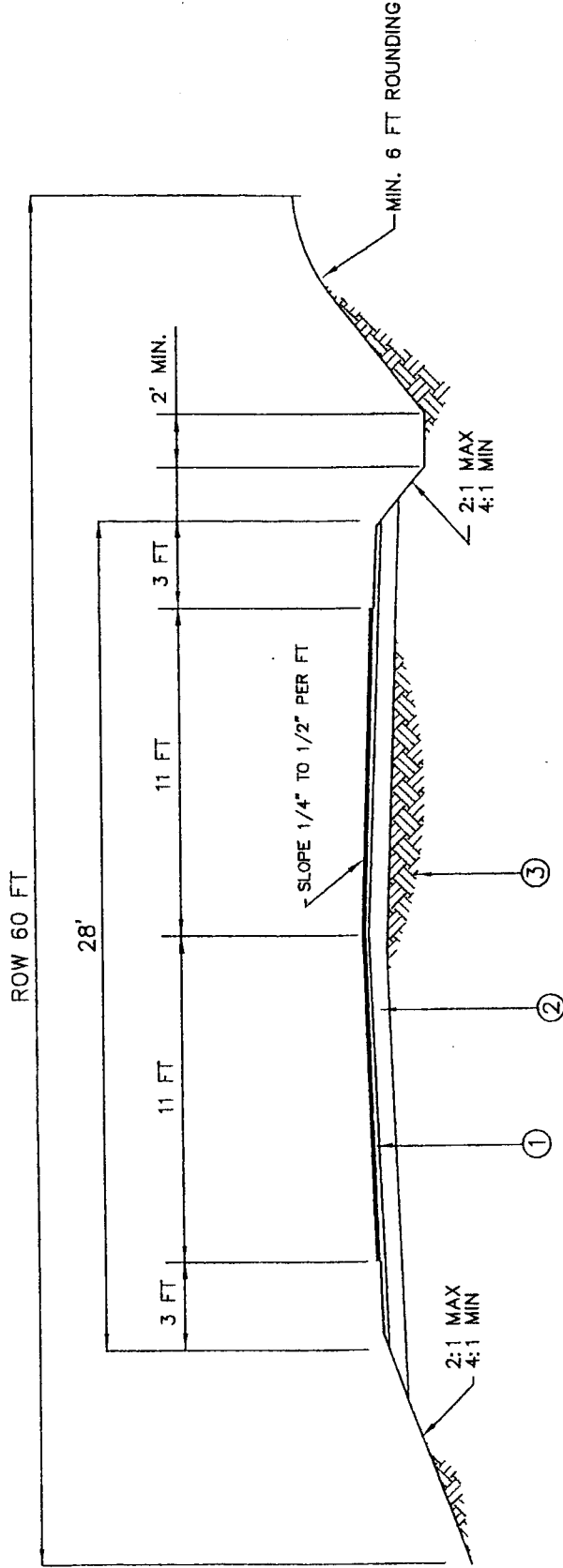

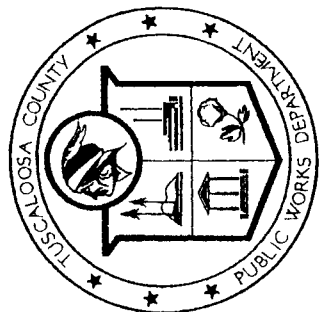



SAND ROAD

GENERAL

Tuscaloosa County will accept sealed bids until Wednesday, May 22, 2013 for base processing on Sand Road. The purpose of the project is to construct the base course on the roadbed for paving. All work shall be in accordance with the Alabama Department of Transportation Standard Specifications for Highway Construction, 2012 edition (hereafter referred to as Specifications). There shall be no direct payment made or extra compensation for any work performed other than for the items on the bid sheet. It is understood that the Contractor's compensation for any additional work required by the specifications or this bid document will be included in other bid items of work. The contractor shall have a supervisor on the jobsite who is experienced and qualified in the construction of roads. All contractors submitting a bid shall be licensed by the State of Alabama Licensing Board for General Contractors to perform the type of work described within this bid package.

BID BOND

Each bid submission shall be accompanied by a bid bond of the prescribed form made payable to the Tuscaloosa County Commission in the amount of five (5) percent of the Total Bid Amount. Bidder shall submit the Bid Bond using the Bid Bond form attached.

PERFORMANCE BOND

The successful bidder shall, within 10 days after the award of the contract shall furnish to the County Engineer an acceptable surety bond in the amount equal to 100 percent of the Total Bid Amount. Bidder shall submit the Performance Bond using the Performance Bond form attached.

BASE WORK

The entire roadway within the limits of the project shall be constructed to the roadway template and dimensions provided by the County Engineer or his representative. Construction shall conform to the requirements set forth in Section 301 of the Alabama Department Of Transportation Standard Specifications for Highway Construction, 2012 edition except as herein modified. Tuscaloosa County will provide the base material. The base will be dumped in sufficient quantities and stockpiled along the centerline of the road. The contractor will be responsible for processing, shaping, and compacting the base material. Care shall be taken during the compaction operations so that uniform density is obtained. Compaction tests shall be performed in accordance with Section 306 of the Specifications. The contractor shall be responsible for contacting the Tuscaloosa County Engineer's office to request compaction tests. Notification shall be made at least 48 hours in advance.

The base processing operation shall be limited to the amount of materials that can be mixed, shaped, and compacted by the end of the working day. No deviation from the above will be allowed without written permission of the Engineer.

AGGREGATE TYPE SURFACE

This work shall be in accordance with the requirements in Section 430 of the specifications. The materials used shall be AHD #2 and AHD #5, and shall conform to the requirements in Section 801 of the specifications. The materials to be used will be supplied and stocked on the project by Tuscaloosa County. There will be no cost to the contractor for the materials. The contractor shall spread the materials at the direction of the County Engineer or his representative. There shall be no direct payment made to the contractor for the placement of the material. The cost of placement of the material shall be an incidental

cost of the project. It is intended for this material to be used as needed for repairs to the roadway during construction.

PRIME

The contractor shall submit a contingency bid for Bituminous Treatment Type "A" (Prime). Tuscaloosa County will perform this work with its own forces if possible. A minimum of twenty four (24) hours advance notice shall be provided by the contractor in order for the County to schedule the work. The notice may not be given until all compaction tests have passed on the section of roadway to be primed. If the County can not schedule the work in a timely manner the Contractor will be authorized to perform the work. As soon as possible after obtaining passing compaction tests the contractor shall contact the County prior to priming the section of roadway and at that point a determination will be made as to whether the Contractor or the County will perform the prime work.

Work shall meet the requirements of Section 401 of the Specifications. Specific attention is directed to Section 401.03(d)4. Special Details. The contractor shall be required to sand the prime and keep the road open to traffic at no extra compensation. The contractor will also be responsible for maintenance and repair of the primed roadway until accepted by the County.

CONSTRUCTION STAKES, LINES, AND GRADES

A typical roadway cross section is enclosed. The contractor shall place super elevation in the curves according to AASHTO standards.

MAINTENANCE OF ROADS AND DETOURS

The contractor shall, at his expense, keep the road open to all traffic while performing the required improvements. The Contractor shall keep the portion of the project being used by public traffic, whether it is through or local traffic; in such condition that traffic will be adequately accommodated. He shall provide and maintain in a safe condition temporary approaches or crossings and intersections with trails, roads, streets, businesses, residences, garages, and farms. Where so approved by the Engineer, the Contractor may bypass traffic over an approved detour route.

Upon notification by the County of needed repairs, the Contractor shall perform required repairs without delay; otherwise, the County will perform the repairs and the cost thereof will be deducted from amounts due on the contract. The Contractor shall have employees available 24 hours a day and shall provide the County with a list of contact numbers in the event repairs are required. The Contractor will be allowed 2 hours from the time of contact to begin any required repairs. The Contractor shall indemnify the County from any claims or damages arising due to failure of the Contractor to keep the roads or detours in an open and safe condition for the traveling public.

The contractor shall furnish, erect, and maintain barricades, warning signs, delineators, and flagmen in accordance with the "Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices".

MAILBOXES

Mailboxes within the limits of operations shall be removed by the Contractor before work is begun and set temporarily where they will be accessible both to the mail carrier and the patron. As soon as the state of the work permits and the Engineer directs, all mail boxes shall be reset by the Contractor in permanent locations in compliance with Postal Regulations. Mail boxes or supports that have been damaged by the Contractor shall be replaced at his expense. The cost of removing, temporarily resetting, and permanently resetting mail boxes shall be included in the prices bid for the various pay items of work and no direct payment will be made for this work.

PAYMENT

Payment for the base processing will be made on a per roadbed station basis. Payment will be in accordance with Sections 230.04 and 230.05 of the Specifications.

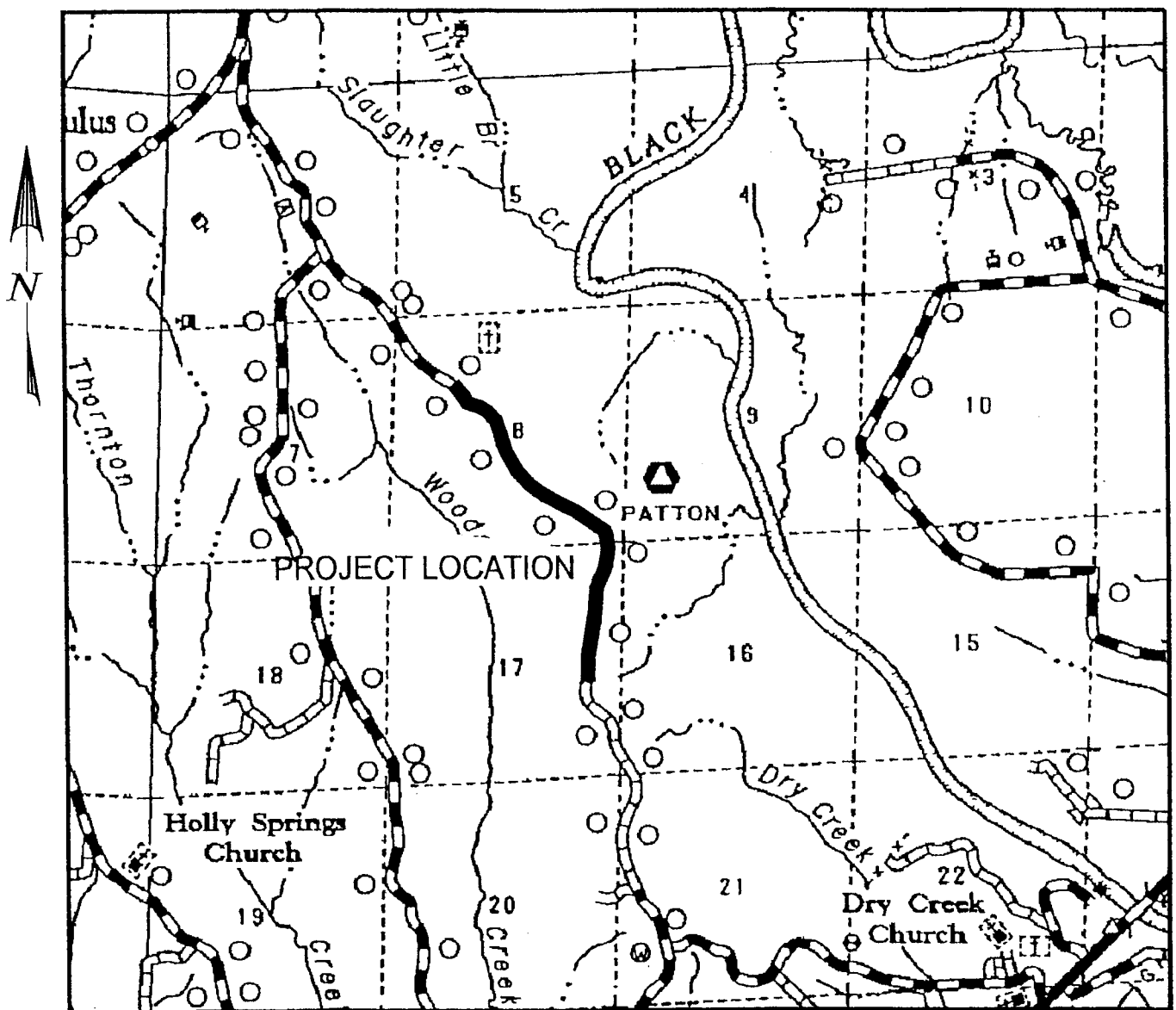

SAND ROAD

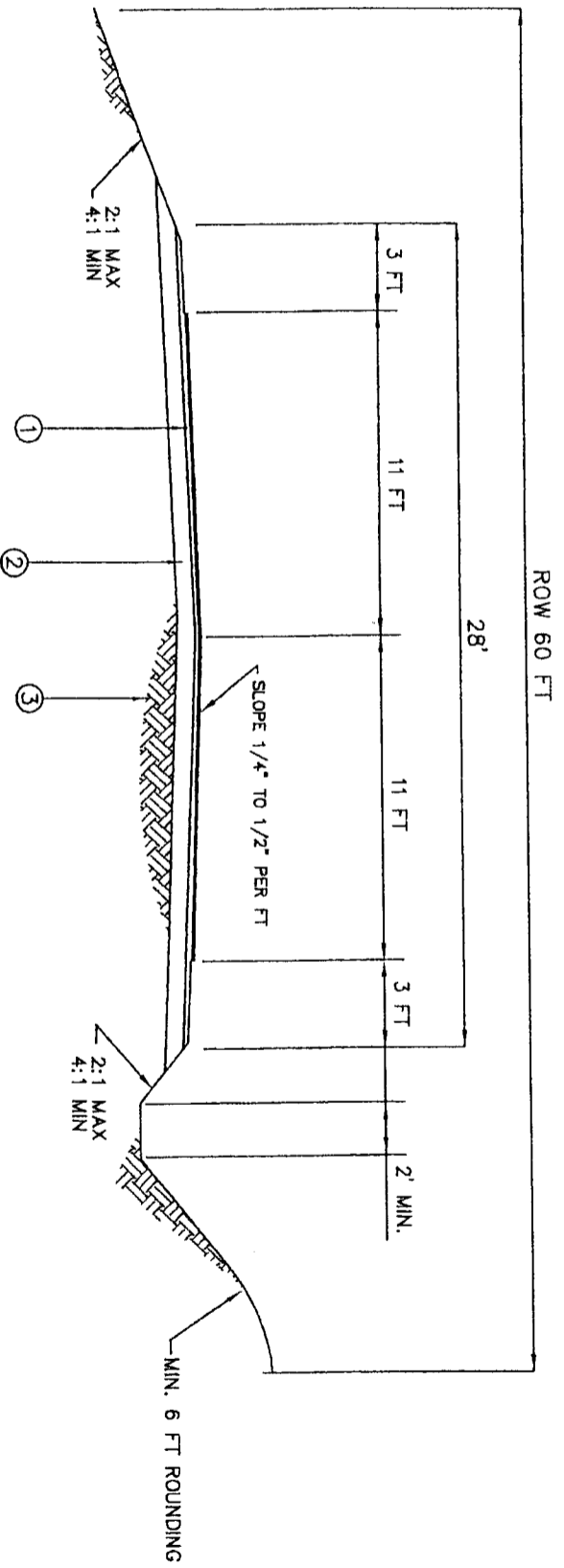


