This being the date and hour to which the Tuscaloosa County Commission adjourned, the County Commission met pursuant to such adjournment with Probate Judge W. Hardy McCollum presiding as Chairman. The following members were present:

Commissioner Bobby Miller moved, seconded by Commissioner Stan Acker, the County Commission voted unanimously to approve the "Insolvents, Errors and Taxes in Litigation for 2012 and Uncollected Insolvents and Taxes in Litigation for Previous Years" report, as prepared by Tax Collector Peyton Cochrane.

Commissioner Stan Acker moved, seconded by Commissioner Jerry Tingle, the County Commission voted unanimously to adopt a resolution for the establishment of the Stacks' Family Cemetery, 5250.5 sq. ft. on 0.12 acres of land on Gorgas School Road. The Tuscaloosa County Board of Health has conducted a site evaluation, reviewed the submitted information and finds that the cemetery meets all of the minimum requirements. Whereas no person or persons have appeared to contest or protest the location or establishment of said cemetery, the Commission finds that the application is due to be granted and is hereby approved.

Commissioner Bobby Miller moved, seconded by Commissioner Stan Acker, the County Commission voted unanimously to adopt a resolution approving a preliminary plat submitted by CivilWorx.

Commissioner Reginald Murray moved, seconded by Commissioner Bobby Miller, the County Commission voted unanimously to waive item #4 (Subdivision Regulations Waiver Requests), on the official agenda, regarding Tinker Mobile Home Park and allow them to move forward with their request. Jurisdiction of this property falls under Tuscaloosa County Subdivision Regulations and the City of Tuscaloosa is requesting the County waive any requirements that the owner would be subject to and upon such approval, the request will be brought back before the City of Tuscaloosa for final approval.

Commissioner Bobby Miller moved, seconded by Commissioner Stan Acker, the County Commission voted unanimously to authorize the Engineering Department to post the following (recommended) speed limit signage:

William Kelley Road - 45 MPH
John Collins Road - 35 MPH
Wallace Ferry Road - 35 MPH
Blackburn Road - 35 MPH

Commissioner Bobby Miller made a motion to reject and rebid proposals for the purchase of Geogrid Material. After discussion, Commissioner Miller withdrew his motion. After further discussion, Commissioner Reginald Murray moved, seconded by Commissioner Bobby Miller, the County Commission voted unanimously to reject the bids opened on June 26, 2013 and readvertise for Geogrid Fabric.

Commissioner Jerry Tingle moved, seconded by Commissioner Reginald Murray, the County Commission voted unanimously to assist with the 9th Annual Holt Lake Cleanup Project on August 10, 2013, hosted by Tombigbee Resource and Development Council. The assistance will be for landfill charges associated with the disposal of waste generated for the cleanup.

Commissioner Reginald Murray moved, seconded by Commissioner Jerry Tingle, to amend the contract with McGiffert and Associates in the amount of \$31,200.00, for the Tuscaloosa County Infrastructure Efficiency Project. After further discussion, Commissioner Reginald Murray moved, seconded by Commissioner Jerry Tingle, to amend the motion to include the other projects that were submitted. The

amended motion passed unanimously. The other projects, (grant applications to be submitted to Alabama Department of Economic and Community Affairs), are listed below. The grant funds being submitted to ADECA total \$10,021,230.00. The matching funds would total \$1,114,856.00. If everything is approved, an additional \$1,185,369.00 will be required for engineering, architectural work, construction, inspection and testing, for a grand total of \$12,321,455.00.



There being no further business to come before the Tuscaloosa County Commission, the meeting adjourned to Wednesday, July 31, 2013.





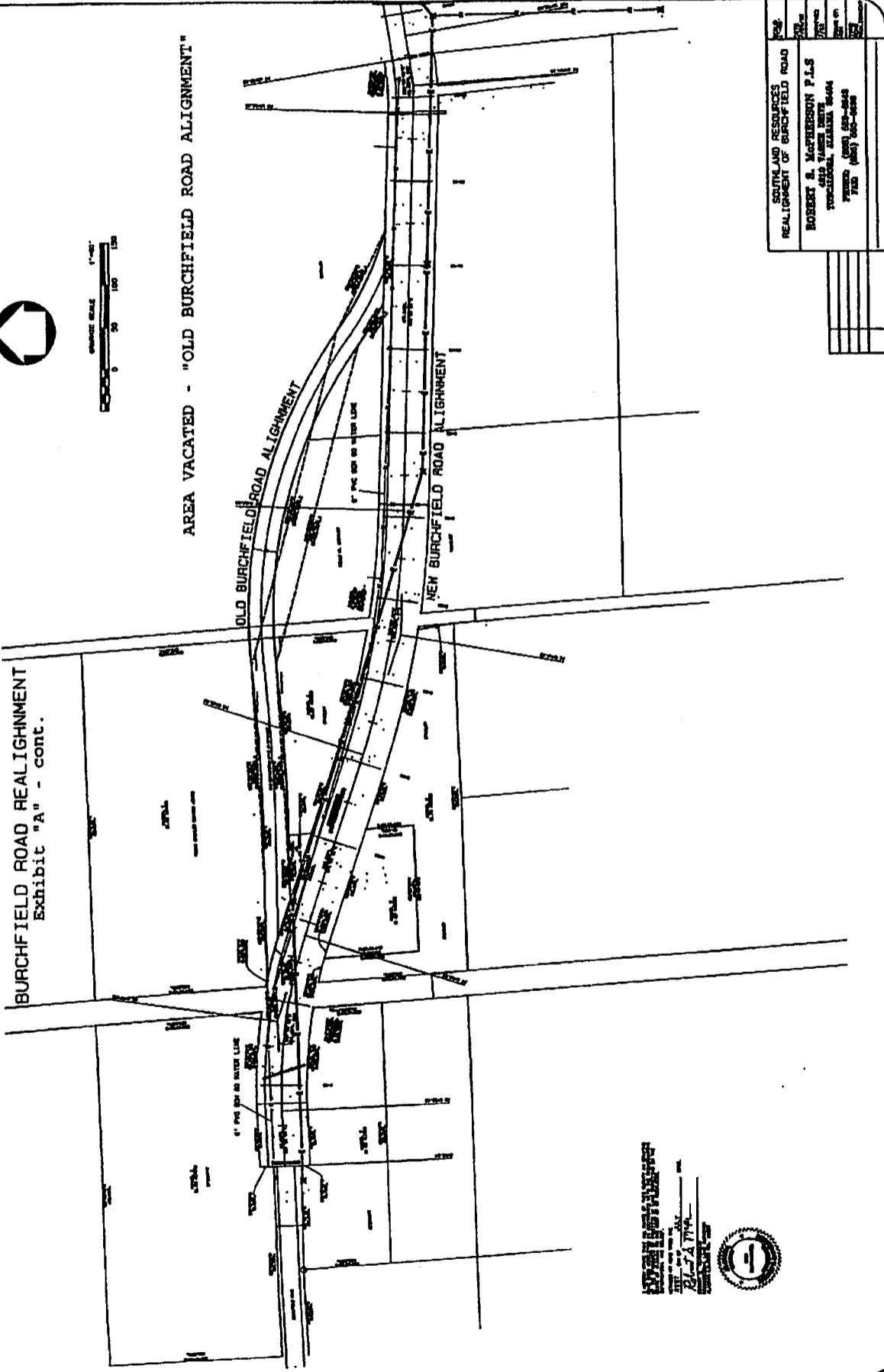
