This being the date and hour to which the Tuscaloosa County Commission adjourned, the County Commission met pursuant to such adjournment with Probate Judge W. Hardy McCollum presiding as Chairman. The following members were present:

Commissioner Jerry Tingle moved, seconded by Commissioner Bobby Miller, the County Commission voted unanimously to authorize payment to the City of Tuscaloosa in the amount of \$12,322.67 for costs associated with the waterline relocation on the Crescent Ridge Road resurfacing project.

Commissioner Bobby Miller moved, seconded by Commissioner Reginald Murray, the County Commission voted unanimously to authorize payment of invoices to:

Commissioner Stan Acker moved, seconded by Commissioner Bobby Miller, the County Commission voted unanimously to accept the bid for Herbicide application from Edko, LLC, in the amount of \$248,048.08, pending review and recommendation from the Engineering Department.

Commissioner Bobby Miller moved, seconded by Commissioner Jerry Tingle, the County Commission voted unanimously to reject and rebid the bids submitted on Motor Graders that were opened on February 26, 2014. The lowest bidder, Thompson Tractor, did not fully met specifications as set by the Engineering Department.

Commissioner Bobby Miller moved, seconded by Commissioner Jerry Tingle, the County Commission voted unanimously to adopt a resolution approving and accepting a preliminary plat submission for Riverbend Woods Subdivision.

Commissioner Reginald Murray moved, seconded by Commissioner Bobby Miller, the County Commission voted unanimously to adopt a resolution approving and accepting a preliminary plat submission for GSI Properties Subdivision, Resurvey of Lots 9-11.

Commissioner Stan Acker moved, seconded by Commissioner Jerry Tingle, the County Commission voted unanimously to adopt a resolution approving and accepting a preliminary plat submission for Pinion Estates, Phase 2.

Commissioner Reginald Murray moved, seconded by Commissioner Bobby Miller, the County Commission voted unanimously to authorize Planning Director Farrington Snipes to submit an application for the Transportation Alternative Program 80/20 Grant through ALDOT and authorize McGiffert and Associates, LLC, to perform the engineering work on the Palmore Park, Fosters Ferry Road, Joe Mallisham Parkway, U.S. Highway 11, Oakdale School project. The grant maximum is \$400,000 with minimum of 20% matching funds plus the design for the project and the application preparation.

Commissioner Reginald Murray moved, seconded by Commissioner Bobby Miller, the County Commission voted unanimously to approve the 60th Avenue Drainage Study contract fee proposal from Almon Associates in the amount of \$14,600.00.

Commissioner Bobby Miller moved, seconded by Commissioner Jerry Tingle, the County Commission voted unanimously to approve the contract for design and preparation of construction documents on the 2013 Transportation Alternatives Program Grant

Professional Services Contract for the Tuscaloosa County Hazard Mitigation Plan and award the contract to LEHE Planning, LLC, for an amount not to exceed \$29,000.00 which will be paid through a grant from the State EMA.

Commissioner Stan Acker moved, seconded by Commissioner Reginald Murray, the County Commission voted unanimously to approve funding for the Smithsonian Travel Exhibit presented at the Northport Heritage Museum in the amount of \$5,000.00 and the funds be administered through the City of Northport.

Commissioner Stan Acker moved, seconded by Commissioner Bobby Miller, the County Commission voted unanimously to authorize the Engineering Department to post stop signs at the intersection of Stonehedge Road and Freeman's Bend Road creating an "All Way Stop."

Commissioner Jerry Tingle moved, seconded by Commissioner Stan Acker, the County Commission voted unanimously for the funds left over from the \$12,000.00 approved by the Commission for concrete and site work for the storm shelter for the Town of Coaling be used for handicap access and electrical work.

Commissioner Jerry Tingle moved, seconded by Commissioner Stan Acker, the County Commission voted unanimously to authorize \$200,000 from the \$1.5 million approved for purchase of land in districts 2 and 4 to be used for purchasing Bama Rock Garden Property (59.04 acres). The purchase of this property is subject to a survey and examination to ensure the original Bama Rock Garden property lies within the boundaries of the survey.

Commissioner Jerry Tingle moved, seconded by Commissioner Bobby Miller, to add Hidden Springs Drive, Gulf Drive, and Lake Retreat Drive to County Road Maintenance. After discussion, Commissioner Tingle withdrew the motion, until the following Commission meeting, pending review of the drives by the Engineering Department.

Commissioner Jerry Tingle moved, seconded by Commissioner Reginald Murray, the County Commission voted to enter into a

50/50 Participation Project with the City of Tuscaloosa to complete the drive, a parking lot, lighting and restrooms for Hurricane Creek Park. Total funding from the County General Fund will be \$200,000.00.

Commissioner Bobby Miller moved, seconded by Commissioner Jerry Tingle, to add Delta Drive to County Road Maintenance. After discussion, Commissioner Miller withdrew the motion, until the following Commission meeting, pending review of the drive by the Engineering Department.

The Commission retired into Executive Session.

Following Executive Session, Chairman W. Hardy McCollum called the Commission back to order.


Upon request by County Attorney, Robert Spence, and upon motion by Commissioner Stan Acker, seconded by Commissioner Jerry Tingle, the County Commission voted unanimously for County Engineer, Bobby Hagler, to accept payment in the amount of \$18,000 from the bonding company for Oak Creek Subdivision Phase I and apply the funds to road repairs.

Commissioner Jerry Tingle moved, seconded by Commissioner Stan Acker, the County Commission voted unanimously to appoint Tim Davis to the Community Corrections Board, at the request of the University of Alabama, due to the resignation of Dr. Tim Hebson.

Upon request by County Attorney, Robert Spence, and upon motion by Commissioner Stan Acker, seconded by Commissioner Jerry Tingle, the County Commission voted unanimously to waive all fines associated with Morgans Landing subdivision and the violation of Subdivision Regulations for advertising lots for sale before approval of the plat. The developer removed all advertisements associated with the subdivision.


There being no further business to come before the Tuscaloosa County Commission, the meeting adjourned to Wednesday, April 2, 2014.









Dear Mr. Hagler,

We are writing to request adjustments to our engineering contract to correspond with changes required by the Alabama Department of Transportation (ALDOT) on the above referenced bridge project. The Hydraulic Analysis performed by ALDOT shows that the bridge geometry required is significantly higher and longer than is currently provided for by our current scope of services. The additional height and length of the bridge necessitates that the roadway shift horizontally in order to avoid filling the wetlands and the stream channel adjacent to the roadway approach. I have attached a small drawing showing the creek layout as well as the proposed roadway approach layout that avoids said channel. In addition, the re-alignment requires a superelevation transition in the bridge in order to meet a 35MPH design speed. We reviewed this alignment as well as other alternatives with the Tuscaloosa County Engineering Staff and determined this alignment and design speed is the most desirable of the alternatives evaluated. With the additional length of the bridge, the additional complexity of the super elevation transition in the bridge, and the required realignment of the roadway, we respectfully ask that you consider the following additions to the scope and corresponding fees for our contract.

Additional Geotechnical Engineering:

Our current contract scope is based on a three span bridge replacing the existing bridge in approximately the same location as the existing bridge. The increase to a six span bridge may require additional soil borings. It is our understanding that the ALDOT materials section typically requires a soil boring at each bent; however, they will allow a reduction from that number if uniform soil conditions are present. Based on our discussions with TTL, Inc., we assume that the soil conditions at this location will be uniform. If the soil borings confirm this assumption, we will be able to drill the same number of locations that was originally included in our contract. If, however, the soil boring data refutes our assumption, we will be required to collect the additional borings. TTL, Inc. will be providing this service for us. We therefore request that our contract scope of services be amended to incorporate the attached Proposal from TTL, Inc. dated February 14, 2014, and to add an optional Lump Sum contract fee amount of \$7,000 for additional soil borings, in the event of non-uniform conditions. We will not proceed with the additional borings without prior approval of the county engineer.

Additional Roadway Approach Engineering:

Our current contract does not include roadway realignment design. We request to amend our scope of services to include evaluation of alternate roadway alignments for an additional fee of \$4,600.00.

Additional Bridge Structural Engineering:

Our current contract scope of services under the bridge structural engineering is for a three span AASHTO Girder Bridge in a tangent section with a constant elevation. The required realignment still provides for a tangent section across the bridge, but the proximity of the curve requires that the superelevation transition extend onto the bridge. We request to add to the scope of services to increase the bridge to six spans, and to add detailed design for the superelevation transition as shown on the attached drawing. We request an additional compensation of \$7,000.00 under bridge structural engineering to correspond with the increased complexity in the scope.



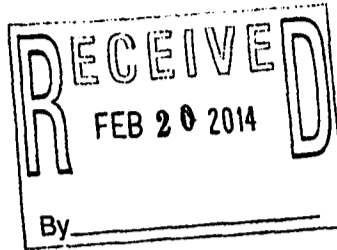

TTL, Inc. (TTL) is pleased to submit this proposal for a bridge foundation report on the above-referenced project. The work performed under this proposal will be in accordance with the following documents.

- ALDOT Procedure 390
- ALDOT Procedure 398
- Checklist and Guidelines for Review of Geotechnical Reports prepared by the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA)

PROJECT INFORMATION

The project consists of replacing the existing bridge over Binlon Creek on Traweek Road in northern Tuscaloosa County. Our previous proposal dated November 19, 2012, and included as Attachment D in Contract for Professional Services between Almon Associates, Inc. and Tuscaloosa County dated November 27, 2012, was based on a bridge replacement project in the preliminary design phase.

Since the time of our proposal and addendum, the project design has been revised. TTL has been provided with an updated layout and profile for the replacement bridge and approaches. We understand the replacement bridge will be a two-lane, six-span AASHTO girder bridge with individual span lengths of 40 feet based on the hydraulic review. It is our understanding that this project will be partially funded through the Alabama Transportation Rehabilitation and Improvement Program (ATRIP). Since the bridge is an AASHTO girder bridge, our work for the replacement bridge will be performed in general accordance with ALDOT-398 Procedure for Conducting Subsurface Investigation and Foundation Reports and our conversations with the ALDOT State Geotechnical Engineer. Revisions to the design of the approaches include realignment of the bridge approaches on both the east and west ends of the bridge. Our work for the bridge approaches will be performed in general accordance with ALDOT-390 Procedure for Conducting Soil Surveys and Preparing Materials Reports.

PROPOSED SCOPE OF SERVICES

- Perform a site visit and field stake planned boring locations measured from the in-place bridge structure.
- Obtain the services of a subcontractor to provide access to proposed boring locations.
- Obtain utility clearances for the planned boring locations.
- Perform soil borings in general accordance with ALDOT-398 and our conversations with the ALDOT State Geotechnical Engineer. We will perform one boring at each abutment and two borings representing the interior bents for a total of four borings. We have based our number of borings on the soil stratum and rock stratum being relatively uniform between boring locations. If conditions are encountered which differ significantly from boring to boring, additional borings (up to 1 boring per bent) may be necessary to comply with ALDOT 398. Any additional borings will be billed at TTL's current ALDOT approved rates. We will drill to auger refusal and rock core approximately 20 feet at each location to estimate the quality of the rock. COMPENSATION

We recommend a budget of \$23,000.00 for the bridge foundation report with four borings and assisting Tuscaloosa County in the preparation of a materials report for the relocated approaches. If differing conditions are encountered which require additional borings (up to 1 boring per bent), we recommend increasing the overall project geotechnical budget by \$6,400.00 to cover the additional drilling costs. The additional drilling will not be performed unless specifically authorized by Tuscaloosa County prior to performing the work.

We are writing to request adjustments to our engineering contract to correspond with changes required by the Alabama Department of Transportation (ALDOT) on the above referenced bridge project. The Hydraulic Analysis performed by ALDOT shows that the bridge geometry required is significantly higher and longer than is currently provided for by our current scope of services. The additional height and length of the bridge necessitates that the roadway shift horizontally in order to minimize wetland fill adjacent to the roadway approach. I have attached a small drawing showing the existing contours as well as the proposed roadway approach layout that minimizes potential wetland fill. In addition, the re-alignment requires a horizontal curve in the bridge. We have reviewed this alignment, as well as other alternatives, with the Tuscaloosa County Engineering Staff and determined it to be the most desirable of the alternatives evaluated. With the additional length of the bridge, the additional complexity of the horizontal curve in the bridge, and the required realignment of the roadway, we respectfully ask that you consider the following additions to the scope and corresponding fees for our contract.

Additional Geotechnical Engineering:

Our current contract scope is based on a three span bridge replacing the existing bridge in approximately the same location as the existing bridge. The increase to a six span bridge may require additional soil borings. It is our understanding that the ALDOT materials section typically requires a soil boring at each bent; however, they will allow a reduction from that number if uniform soil conditions are present. Based on our discussions with TTL, Inc., we assume that the soil conditions at this location will be uniform. If the soil borings confirm this assumption, we will be able to drill the same number of locations that was originally included in our contract. If, however, the soil boring data refutes our assumption, we will be required to collect the additional borings. TTL, Inc. will be providing this service for us. We therefore request that our contract scope of services be amended to incorporate the attached Proposal from TTL, Inc. dated February 14, 2014, and to add an optional Lump Sum contract fee amount of \$5,800 for additional soil borings, in the event of non-uniform conditions. We will not proceed with the additional borings without prior approval of the county engineer.

Additional Roadway Approach Engineering:

Our current contract only includes minor roadway realignment design. We request to amend our scope of services to include evaluation of alternate roadway alignments for an additional fee of \$3,900.00.

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Additional Bridge Structural Engineering:

Our current contract scope of services under the bridge structural engineering is for a three span AASHTO Girder Bridge in a tangent section with a constant elevation. The required realignment still provides for a consistent cross section for the length of the bridge, but the bridge is now in a horizontal curve. We request to add to the scope of services to increase the bridge to a six spans, and to add detailed design for the horizontal curvature in the bridge. We request additional compensation of \$3,500.00 under bridge structural engineering to correspond with the increased complexity in the scope.

Elimination of Categorical Exclusion Preparation

Our current contract scope includes an hourly fee for preparing the categorical exclusion. The Tuscaloosa County Engineering staff has decided to perform this portion of the work in house. We therefore recommend eliminating this line item from our contract scope as well as the removal of the \$3,500.00 previously budgeted for this work.





We are writing to request fee adjustments corresponding to required scope changes on the above referenced project. The Alabama Department of Transportation (ALDOT) is requiring the County to change the design from a culvert to a precast bridge due to soft soils present at the creek crossing. We have evaluated several alternate alignments and design speeds in conjunction with the County Engineering Staff and have determined the most desirable alternate is one that meets a 35 MPH design speed and significantly raises the elevation of the existing bridge. This revised profile, coupled with the change from a culvert to a bridge will require changes to every plan sheet, as well as adjustment to the ROW required. Geotechnical Engineering will also have to be re-done, including new soil borings at the required bent location.

In order to revise the plans and include the required bridge layout sheet, we request an additional fee in the amount of \$19,500.

We have negotiated a fee with TTL to provide the additional drilling as well as revising the foundation report for the required bridge. The proposed fee for these additional services is estimated to be \$13,800. Please find attached the proposal by TTL for the additional Geotechnical Engineering work.

With both scope changes listed above, the total additional costs to the county will be approximately \$33,300.

TTL, Inc. (TTL) is pleased to submit this proposal for a bridge foundation report on the above-referenced project. The work performed under this proposal will be in accordance with the following documents.

- ALDOT Procedure 398
- ALDOT Guidelines for Operation 3-70
- Checklist and Guidelines for Review of Geotechnical Reports prepared by the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA)

PROJECT INFORMATION

The project consists of replacing the existing bridge (BIN 012418) over Thornton Creek on CR 144 (Dobbs Road) in northwestern Tuscaloosa County with a new bridge. TTL previously issued a Bridge Culvert Foundation Report dated May 7, 2013, and a data report dated March 29, 2013, for a Soil Survey report to be completed by Tuscaloosa County. Due to the soft material encountered and the anticipated settlement of the planned bridge culvert, a new bridge has been selected as the replacement for the existing bridge. The borings performed previously for the proposed culvert were not extended to a sufficient depth to provide recommendations for a replacement bridge. Project plan and profile provided to TTL indicates the replacement bridge will be precast concrete and consist of two 34-foot spans. The existing bridge over Thornton Creek is a two-lane, timber and concrete bridge with a length of about 30 feet.

PROPOSED SCOPE OF SERVICES

- Perform a site visit and field stake planned boring locations based on the in-place bridge location.
- Obtain utility clearances for the planned boring locations.

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- Perform soil borings in general accordance with ALDOT Procedure 398 and Guidelines for Operation 3-70. We will perform a boring at one abutment and one boring for the interior bent (total of 2 borings). We anticipate one of the borings will have to be drilled through the bridge deck. We have assumed that Tuscaloosa County will perform the necessary repairs to the bridge deck upon completion of the borings. The borings will be performed to a depth of 80 feet below the ground surface in general accordance with AASHTO T-206.
- Split-spoon sampling will be conducted at approximately 5-foot intervals. The existing bridge is two lanes wide; therefore, we do not anticipate closing the bridge to perform our borings. TTL will provide the necessary traffic control needed to perform the boring through the existing bridge deck.
- Perform laboratory classification testing of selected split-spoon samples to provide general characteristics of the subsurface soils.
- Perform grain size analysis with hydrometer to obtain D-50 values for use by others in determining scour analysis.
- Perform corrosion analysis on water and soil samples.
- Analyze the data and prepare a bridge foundation report.


COMPENSATION

The attached Table I shows our estimates of the unit quantities, the unit rates for performing this work, and the estimated cost for each work task. We recommend a budget of \$13,800.00 for the bridge foundation report.



WHEREAS, the Tuscaloosa County Commission is the governing body of Tuscaloosa County, Alabama; and



WHEREAS, Section 36-22-17 authorizes the County Commission to direct the allowances and amounts received for feeding prisoners be deposited into the county general fund.

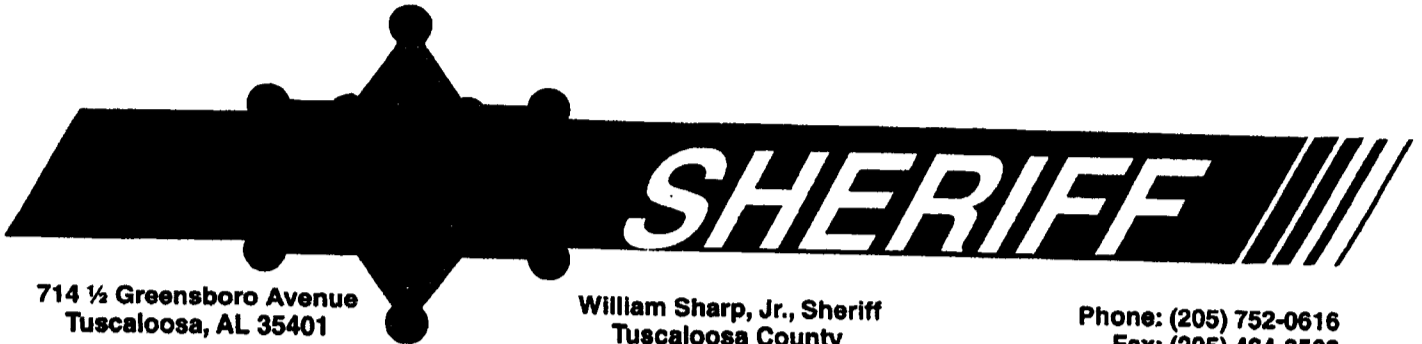
