This being the date and hour to which the Tuscaloosa County Commission adjourned, the County Commission met pursuant to such adjournment with Probate Judge W. Hardy McCollum presiding as Chairman. The following members were present:

Commissioner Gary Youngblood moved, seconded by Commissioner Reginald Murray, the County Commission voted unanimously to authorize payments as follows:

Commissioner Bobby Miller moved, seconded by Commissioner Reginald Murray, the County Commission voted unanimously to amend the Public Works Department budget by increasing the equipment budget by \$627,000.00, contingent upon the Chief Financial Officer and County Engineer reviewing the information presented by Commissioner Miller.

Commissioner Don Wallace moved, seconded by Commissioner Bobby Miller, the County Commission voted unanimously to sell Truck 101A (VIN#1FTNX21F62EC27375) to Samantha Volunteer Fire Department for the price of \$2,500.00.

Commissioner Bobby Miller moved, seconded by Commissioner Reginald Murray, the County Commission voted unanimously to depart from the order of business set forth in the official agenda to consider a request from Alabama Department of Rehabilitation Services.

Commissioner Bobby Miller moved, seconded by Commissioner Gary Youngblood, the County Commission voted unanimously to authorize the Engineering Department to review the request from Alabama Department of Rehabilitation Services to improve Old Marion Road and to take the appropriate action.

The property owner has executed a "Right to Enter" form.

The Alabama Onsite Wastewater Association (AOWA) is a non-profit association representing the septic tank installers, pumpers, manufacturers, and portable restroom operators in Alabama. Two years ago we initiated a program where we, in conjunction with the county health departments, identify homeowners that need septic systems and are financially unable to pay for the system. Thus far we have helped over 20 families in Alabama. We rely on donated tanks, field line products and labor to accomplish the project. AOWA pays for incidental expenses and purchases a septic tank if we can't find someone to donate a septic tank. It is important for us to keep our costs down so that we may help others in Alabama.

Occasionally, the county health department will require additional dirt to correctly install the system. As you know, "dirt cheap" isn't an accurate phrase. We are attempting to install a septic system for Ms. Wanda Patton on Dry Creek Road in Fosters, Alabama. To complete this job we need 8 truck loads of dirt. Ms. Ann Blackmon, Tuscaloosa County Health Department, has directed me to the Tuscaloosa County Commission to solicit your help in this project.
