This being the date and hour to which the Tuscaloosa County Commission adjourned, the County Commission met pursuant to such adjournment with Probate Judge W. Hardy McCollum presiding as Chairman. The following members were present:

Commissioner Bobby Miller moved, seconded by Commissioner Don Wallace, the County Commission voted unanimously to authorize payment of \$7,688.00 to Almon Associates for construction management of the Duncanville Middle School Access Road Project.

Commissioner Bobby Miller moved, seconded by Commissioner Gary Youngblood, the County Commission voted unanimously to authorize payment of \$101,010.20 to GFC Construction, Inc., for work completed on the Duncanville Middle School Access Road Project.

Commissioner Gary Youngblood moved, seconded by Commissioner Don Wallace, the County Commission voted unanimously to authorize Coaling-Hagler Road as the truck route through Coaling at the recommendation of Town of Coaling Mayor, Charley Foster, and Members of the Council.

It was agreed that Fosters Water Treatment, LLC, is to be treated the same as other developers on similar projects. The standard \$2.00 per linear foot fee is not a conditional requirement for obtaining the permit.

Commissioner Bobby Miller moved, seconded by Commissioner Don Wallace, the County Commission voted unanimously to confirm the reappointment of Tom Joiner as a member of the Board of Directors of the City of Tuscaloosa / County Port Authority as a joint appointee, for a term to expire December 20, 2013.

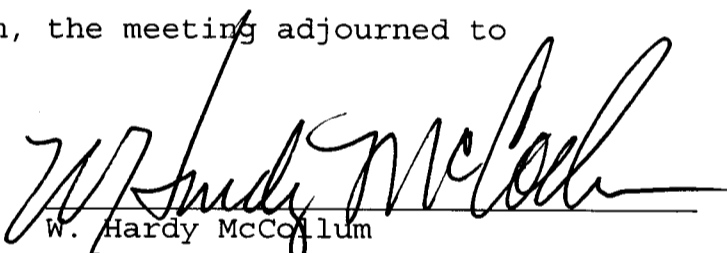
county sales and use tax during the first full weekend of August, 2009, as authorized by Act 2006-574, generally referred to as the State Sales Tax Holiday Legislation.

3. Post No Truck signs on Lower Coaling Road from U.S. Highway #11 to Hagler-Coaling Road.
4. ~~Post Truck Route on Hagler-Coaling Road from U.S. Highway #11 to Wire Road and beyond.~~
5. Post 35-mile speed limit on Hagler-Coaling Road from Police Jurisdiction Limit (South) to Hagler Drive, and then post 25-mile speed limit from Hagler Drive thru the Town of Coaling. *James X*
6. Place speed tables on Lower Coaling Road and Middle Coaling Road if County deems necessary to control safety. The Town of Coaling contends these speed tables are not wanted but are necessary to control safety thru these residential areas along these two roads. *LO*
7. A survey was conducted by Coaling Town Engineer and concluded that the railroad crossing on Hagler-Coaling Road would have a clearance of 2 inches on a low boy trailer that has a height of 10 inches and a wheel base of 32 feet. The clearance on Middle Coaling is 1-½ inches. The non-clearance on Lower Coaling Road is 2-inch drag.

These areas of concern have been discussed with the Town of Coaling Police Chief.

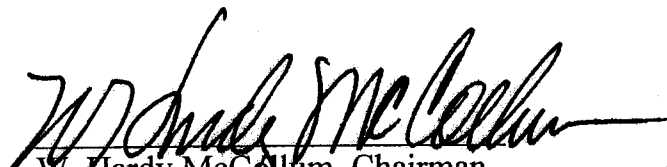
WHEREAS, Act 2006-574 enacted by the Alabama Legislature during the 2006 Regular Session, provides for a State Sales Tax Holiday, and provides that counties and municipalities may join with the state in exempting certain items from sales and use taxes; and

WHEREAS, the Tuscaloosa County Commission has determined that it is in the best interest of the citizens of Tuscaloosa County to exempt from sales and use taxes on school supplies as provided for by law.

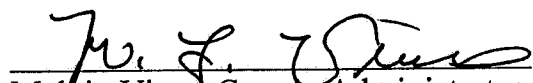
NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Tuscaloosa County Commission that all "covered items" shall be exempt from any county sales and use tax during the same period, beginning at 12:01 a.m. on the first Friday in August 2009 (August 7, 2009) and ending at twelve midnight the following Sunday (August 9, 2009), subject to all terms, conditions, definitions, time periods, and rules as provided by Act 2006-574, except that the time period shall only be as specified above and not for all years thereafter.
