This being the date and hour to which the Tuscaloosa County Commission adjourned, the County Commission met pursuant to such adjournment with Probate Judge W. Hardy McCollum presiding as Chairman. The following members were present:

Commissioner Bobby Miller moved, seconded by Commissioner Reginald Murray, the County Commission voted unanimously to authorize payment to Almon Associates for work completed on the Duncanville Middle School Access Road Project in the amount of \$9,440.00.

Commissioner Gary Youngblood moved, seconded by Commissioner Bobby Miler, the County Commission voted unanimously to authorize payment to Tomlin Construction for the retainage held on the Lakeview Elementary School Access Road Project in the amount of \$84,784.83.

Commissioner Gary Youngblood moved, seconded by Commissioner Bobby Miller, the County Commission voted unanimously to depart from the order of business set forth in the official agenda to consider a payment to Burk-Kleinpeter.

Commissioner Gary Youngblood moved, seconded by Commissioner Don Wallace, the County Commission voted unanimously to authorize payment to Burk-Kleinpeter for design work on the Brookwood Parkway Extension Project in the amount of \$7,500.00.

Commissioner Gary Youngblood moved, seconded by Commissioner Don Wallace, the County Commission voted unanimously to award the single bid for metal pipe (full-coated) and the single bid for metal pipe (non-coated) to Contech Construction Products, Inc.

Commissioner Don Wallace moved, seconded by Commissioner Reginald Murray, the County Commission voted unanimously to approve the low bid of \$443,175.89 to Perma Corporation for the Carroll's Creek Water Authority/Tuscaloosa County Water Expansion Project on Barger Road and Highway 69 North, with the understanding that any unused contingency funds will be returned to Carroll's Creek Water Authority and not to Tuscaloosa County.

Commissioner Reginald Murray's motion to award the bid for the Culver Road Sanitary Sewer Project to the low bidder, Bama Utility Contractors, Inc., was seconded by Commissioner Don Wallace. Commissioner Don Wallace's motion to table for two

weeks and request the City of Tuscaloosa to contribute a pro rata share of 11% to the project was approved on a three to two vote with Commissioners Miller and Murray casting the NAY votes.

Commissioner Bobby Miller moved, seconded by Commissioner Don Wallace, the County Commission voted unanimously to approve a grant from the State of Alabama in the amount of \$50,000.00 for the West Alabama Youth Football Association.

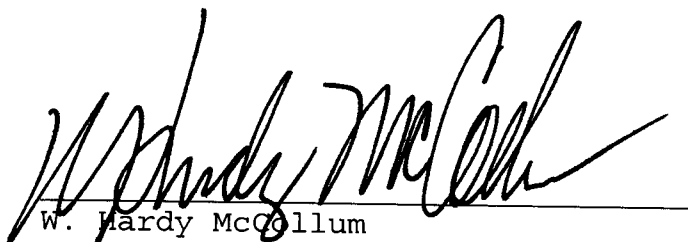

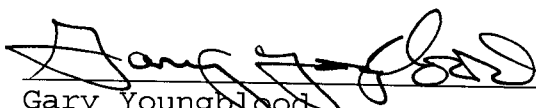
There being no further business to come before the Tuscaloosa County Commission, the meeting adjourned to Wednesday, November 4, 2009.



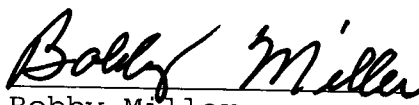

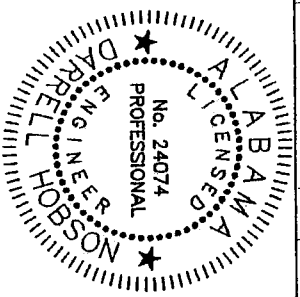

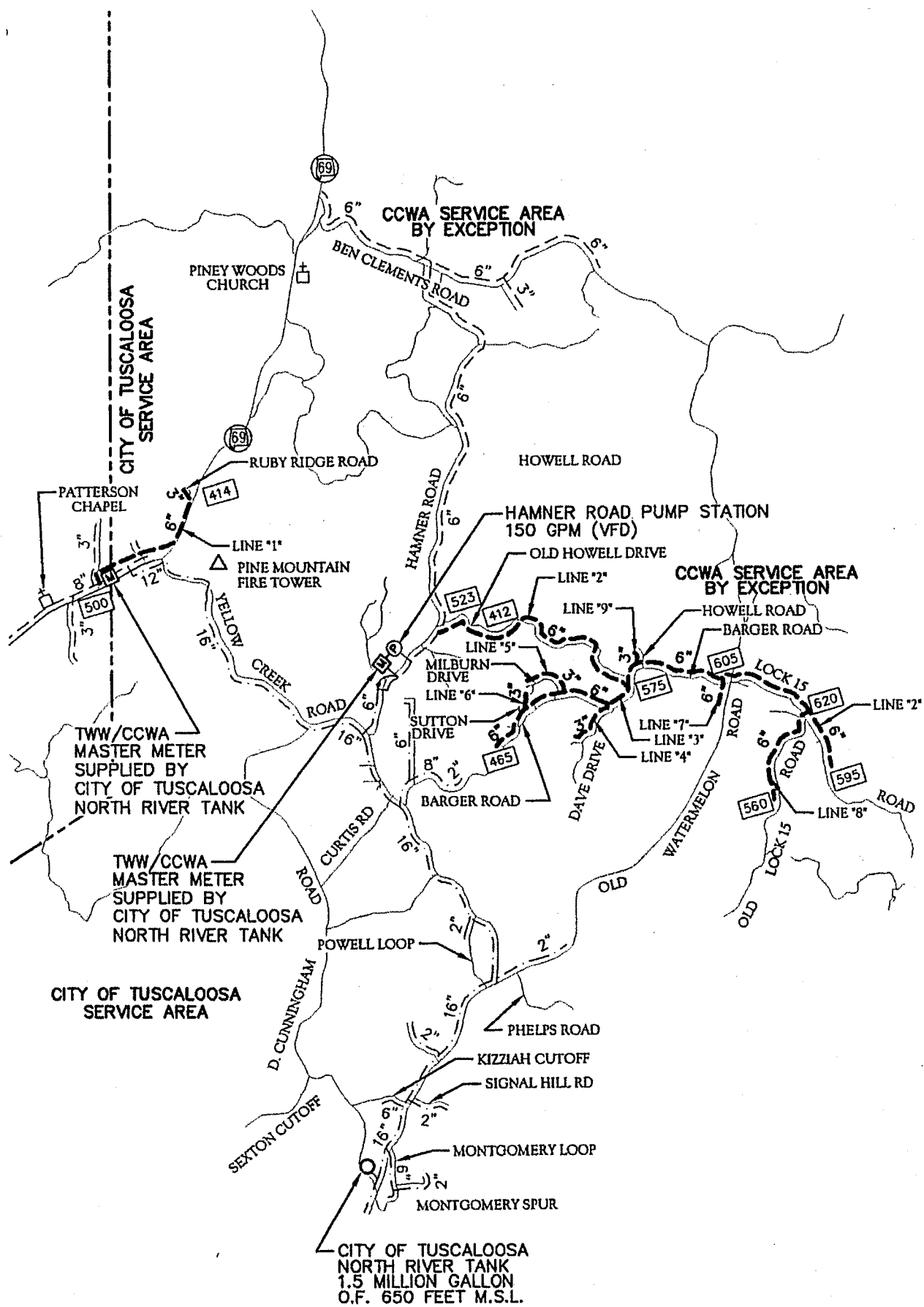

RESOLUTION OF THE TUSCALOOSA COUNTY COMMISSION
DESIGNATING A RECOVERY ZONE FOR PURPOSES OF THE AMERICAN
RECOVERY AND REINVESTMENT ACT OF 2009

WHEREAS, the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 (ARRA) was signed into law on February 17, 2009, which includes the following statement of purposes:

1. To preserve and create jobs and promote economic recovery;
2. To assist those most impacted by the recession;
3. To provide investments needed to increase economic efficiency by spurring technological advances in sciences and health;
4. To invest in transportation, environmental protection and other infrastructure that will provide long term economic benefits; and
5. To stabilize state and local government budgets, in order to minimize and avoid reductions in essential services and counterproductive state and local tax increases.

WHEREAS, the ARRA provides that gross income does not include interest on any bond designated by the issuer thereof as a recovery zone economic development facility bond or a recovery zone facility bond; and

WHEREAS, the ARRA provides that the proceeds of recovery zone economic development facility bonds must be used for qualified economic development purposes, i.e., expenditures for purposes of promoting development or other economic activity in a recovery zone; and

WHEREAS, the ARRA provides that ninety-five (95%) percent or more of the net proceeds of the recovery zone facility bond must be used for recovery zone property which is in a recovery zone and is in the active conduct of a qualified business by the tax payer in such zone; and

WHEREAS, the ARRA provides with respect to recovery zone economic development facility bonds and recovery zone facility bonds that a recovery zone is (1) any area designated by the issuer of such bonds as having significant poverty, unemployment, rate of home foreclosures, or general distress, (2) any area designated by

the issuer of such bonds as distressed by reason of the closure or realignment of a military installation pursuant to the Defense Base Closure and Realignment Act of 1990; and (3) any area for which a designation as an empowerment zone for a renewal community is in effect; and

WHEREAS, recovery zone bonds are designated to provide tax incentives for state and local government borrowing at lower borrowing costs to promote job creation and economic recovery targeted to areas particularly affected by employment decline; and

WHEREAS, the ARRA provides that recovery zone bonds shall be subject to volume cap allocations, any portion of which received by a county or large municipality may be waived and reallocated in a reasonable manner as such county or large municipality deems in good faith, in its discretion, to be reasonable; and

WHEREAS, Internal Revenue Service Notice 2009-50, provides, in part, that issuers designate eligible recovery zones based on certain specified criteria and that any state, county or large municipality that receives a volume cap allocation for recovery zone bonds may make designations of recovery zones in any reasonable manner as it shall determine in good faith, in its discretion.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Tuscaloosa County Commission, as follows:

1. In order for Tuscaloosa County to avail itself of the economic development stimulus provisions contained in the ARRA, Tuscaloosa County, after careful consideration of all economic indicators in Tuscaloosa County, including but not limited to, loss of employment, rate of home foreclosures, loss of retail sales county-wide and declining tax revenues, in its discretion and in good faith, and in compliance with § 1400U-1(b) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, hereby designates all of Tuscaloosa County, Alabama, the geographic jurisdiction of Tuscaloosa County, as a recovery zone. (The "Recovery Zone").

2. The Recovery Zone has suffered significant unemployment, a large increase in home foreclosures, and general economic distress.

3. All actions of the officers, agents and employees of the issuer that are in conformity with the purposes and intent of this resolution, whether taken before or after the adoption hereof, are hereby ratified, confirmed and adopted.

4. Tuscaloosa County hereby designates the Tuscaloosa County Industrial Development Authority (the "TCIDA") to administer and to serve as issuer of any recovery zone bonds for one or more projects accepted by the TCIDA and for which an allocation is granted by Tuscaloosa County.
