Commissioner Bobby Miller moved, seconded by Commissioner Gary Youngblood, the County Commission voted unanimously to change the County Commission Meetings from the first and third Wednesday to the second and fourth Wednesday in January, 2010.

Commissioner Bobby Miller moved, seconded by Commissioner Reginald Murray, the County Commission voted unanimously to depart from the order of business set forth in the official agenda to consider approval of an agreement between the Tuscaloosa County Commission and Southland Resources, Inc.

Commissioner Don Wallace moved, seconded by Commissioner Reginald Murray, the County Commission voted three to one to authorize a Surface Use and Relocation Agreement between the County and Southland Resources, Inc. This will require a temporary relocation of the Kellerman Burchfield Road for mining purposes. Upon completion of mining activities, Southland will

restore the Kellerman Burchfield Road in its original location and further restore and reclaim the surface of the County rights-of-way. Commissioner Gary Youngblood abstained from casting a vote.

# SURFACE USE AND ROAD RELOCATION AGREEMENT BETWEEN TUSCALOOSA COUNTY AND SOUTHLAND RESOURCES, INC.

Come now, SOUTHLAND RESOURCES, INC. (hereinafter referred to as "Southland") and TUSCALOOSA COUNTY, ALABAMA by and through the TUSCALOOSA COUNTY COMMISSION (hereinafter referred to as "the County") and enter into this Surface Use and Road Relocation Agreement as follows:

- 1. Southland is an Alabama corporation operating coal mining facilities within Tuscaloosa County, Alabama.
- 2. The County owns certain road rights-of-way and public rights-of-way in an area sought to be mined by Southland.
- 3. Southland has expressed an interest in exercising its rights to minerals which lie in close proximity to and beneath the rights-of-way of the County. In order to properly excavate and mine said minerals, certain roadways and rights-of-way will need to be excavated and removed to allow access to the minerals beneath said rights-of-way. The County has agreed to the temporary relocation of the road commonly known as the Kellerman Burchfield Road as shown on Exhibit "A".
- 4. Upon completion of said mining activities, Southland shall restore the Kellerman Burchfield Road in its original location and further restore and reclaim the surface of the County rights-of-way in accordance with all applicable state, Federal and local regulations.
- 5. Both the temporary road constructed pursuant to this Agreement and the final reconstruction of the Kellerman Burchfield Road shall be completed in accordance with existing Tuscaloosa County regulations, and the ALDOT standards for road construction, and shall include all recommended signs and markings as determined by the County Engineer.

- 6. Furthermore, prior to the closure of the Kellerman Burchfield Road and diversion of traffic to the temporary relocation of Kellerman Burchfield Road, the County engineer shall inspect and approve such relocation to determine its compliance with Tuscaloosa County regulations and to ensure the safety of the public traveling upon said temporary roadway.
- 7. Furthermore, prior to the reopening of the Kellerman Burchfield Road after it has been reconstructed, said roadway shall be inspected by the Tuscaloosa County engineer to confirm that it has been constructed in conformity with the Tuscaloosa County regulations, and ALDOT standards and is safe for travel by the public upon said roadway.
- 8. In order to secure the performance of the obligations of Southland in this Agreement, Southland shall post a bond to be approved by Tuscaloosa County prior to any work being performed in the amount of \$60,562.00 to secure the costs to reconstruct the existing Kellerman Burchfield Road after the mining is completed, pursuant to said Agreement. Said Bond will be released upon final inspection and approval by the County Engineer.
- 9. Compensation: Southland will pay the County, as the surface owner, a 5% royalty on the actual coal removed from the right-of-way. The estimated tonnage is approximately 8720 with an average sale price of \$55.00/ton. The total estimated royalty to the County would be approximately \$23,980.00.
- 10. Both parties agree to execute any documents necessary to effectuate the terms and conditions of this Agreement.
- 11. This Agreement shall represent the entirety of the negotiations and agreement of the parties and shall only be modified or supplemented in writing.

12.	Should any of the terms, clauses, paragraphs or conditions of this Agreement be
declared vagu	e, ambiguous or otherwise unenforceable, the remainder of this Agreement shall
remain in full	force and effect.
