# TUSCALOOSA COUNTY COMMISSION MEETING

#### February 17, 2010

This being the date and hour to which the Tuscaloosa County Commission adjourned, the County Commission met pursuant to such adjournment with Probate Judge W. Hardy McCollum presiding as Chairman. The following members were present:

Commissioner Bobby Miller moved, seconded by Commissioner Gary Youngblood, the County Commission voted unanimously to authorize payment to CFM Group for floodplain mapping services in the amount of \$21,035.39.

Commissioner Reginald Murray moved, seconded by Commissioner Bobby Miller, the County Commission voted unanimously to authorize execution of a material pit option for purchase of gravel from Mr. Willie Rogers. This will be a two-year option at \$0.75 per yard.

Commissioner Don Wallace moved, seconded by Commissioner Gary Youngblood, the County Commission voted unanimously to adopt a resolution accepting streets in Lenox South Subdivision, Phases 3 and 4.

Probate Judge W. Hardy McCollum presented a 25-year service pin to Donald Wilder and Anthony McKinstry, both of the Road and Bridge Department, and thanked them for their dedicated service to the citizens of Tuscaloosa County.

Commissioner Bobby Miller moved, seconded by Commissioner Don Wallace, the County Commission voted unanimously to authorize the preparation and submission of a grant application to ADECA for an amount up to \$25,000.00 for the purchase of equipment in the Sheriff's Office.
