
There being no further business to come before the Tuscaloosa County Commission, the meeting adjourned to Wednesday, June 2, 2010.





WHEREAS, the proposals have been received and evaluated according to ADECA guidelines as stated in the Request for Proposals;



WHEREAS, the bids have been tabulated and reviewed by the Project Engineer and the recommendation of award has been received;




**RESOLUTION ACCEPTING STREETS IN
