This being the date and hour to which the Tuscaloosa County Commission adjourned, the County Commission met pursuant to such adjournment with Probate Judge W. Hardy McCollum presiding as Chairman. The following members were present:

Gary Youngblood Don Wallace Bobby Miller Reginald Murray

Commissioner Gary Youngblood moved, seconded by Commissioner Bobby Miller, the County Commission voted unanimously to authorize a renewal of the herbicide contract awarded to Edko, LLC on March 17, 2010. Edko, LLC has agreed to perform the work for the same contract price used last year of \$156,991.76 for two sprayings in 2011.

Commissioner Don Wallace moved, seconded by Commissioner Bobby Miller, the County Commission voted unanimously to authorize payment to McGiffert and Associates for engineering services performed on the Martin Road/Union Chapel Road Intersection Project in the amount of \$27,284.33.

Commissioner Reginald Murray moved, seconded by Commissioner Don Wallace, the County Commission voted unanimously to authorize a subdivision waiver request for improperly installed pipe at the entrance of Lot 6 of Sipsey Cove Subdivision Plat No. 1.

Commissioner Bobby Miller moved, seconded by Commissioner Don Wallace, the County Commission voted unanimously to authorize payment to Burk-Kleinpeter for engineering services on the following projects:

Commissioner Gary Youngblood moved, seconded by Commissioner Bobby Miller, the County Commission voted unanimously to approve the warrants issued to cover Tuscaloosa County's expenditures for the month of January, 2011.

Probate Judge W. Hardy McCollum presented a 30-year service pin to Daisy Smith of the Sheriff's Office and thanked her for her dedicated service to Tuscaloosa County.

Commissioner Bobby Miller moved, seconded by Commissioner Reginald Murray, the County Commission voted unanimously to go into executive session prior to the end of this meeting to discuss matters related to threatened litigation.

Commissioner Bobby Miller moved, seconded by Commissioner Reginald Murray, the County Commission voted unanimously to authorize County Attorney Robert Spence to hire an appraiser for property along Hemphill Road.

Commissioner Don Wallace moved, seconded by Commissioner Bobby Miller, the County Commission voted unanimously to depart from the order of business set forth in the official agenda to consider rescinding a vote authorizing County Attorney Robert Spence to begin condemnation proceedings on a portion of Joe Taylor Road.

Commissioner Don Wallace moved, seconded by Commissioner Gary Youngblood, the County Commission voted unanimously to rescind the vote of September 15, 2010, authorizing County Attorney Robert Spence to begin condemnation proceedings on a portion of Joe Taylor Road.

Commissioner Reginald Murray moved, seconded by Commissioner Gary Youngblood, the County Commission voted unanimously to levy county license fees for alcoholic beverages for fiscal year 2011-2012 in the amounts shown in the exhibit as attached.

Commissioner Don Wallace moved, seconded by Commissioner Gary Youngblood, the County Commission voted unanimously to appoint James Randolph as board member of the Carroll's Creek Water Authority. His term will expire March 1, 2017. Mr. Randolph will replace Ray Glenn whose term expired March 1, 2011.

Commissioner Bobby Miller moved, seconded by Commissioner Reginald Murray, the County Commission voted unanimously to authorize a Certificate of Approval for the issuance of Solid Waste Disposal Facility bonds through the Tuscaloosa County Industrial Development Authority. The Commission previously approved the bond issuance by the Tuscaloosa County Port Authority on December 1, 2010. Since then, bond council has decided that the project being financed by these bonds is more suitable for the Tuscaloosa County Industrial Development Authority.

Chief Deputy Harry Montgomery reported there were no bids for PPE Kits for the scheduled bid opening of February 16, 2011.

Commissioner Don Wallace moved, seconded by Commissioner Gary Youngblood, the County Commission voted unanimously to amend the Solid Waste Authority budget to add \$140,000.00 for two Litter Control Officer positions. This will include salaries for two officers, vehicles, radio equipment, etc.

Commissioner Don Wallace moved, seconded by Commissioner Gary Youngblood, the County Commission voted unanimously that the Litter Control efforts will be under the direction of the Solid Waste Authority.

In response to a report by County Administrator Melvin Vines regarding the number of animal control calls being directed to the County Commission Office from the Sheriff's Department, Probate Judge W. Hardy McCollum instructed Mr. Vines to work with the Civil Service Board to develop a job description and pay range for a position of Animal Control Officer. Commissioner Don Wallace and Judge McCollum asked County Engineer Bobby Hagler if he had personnel to address this problem in the interim.

Commissioner Don Wallace presented a petition with signatures of citizens from Tierce Lake Road in Northport requesting speed tables.

Commissioner Gary Youngblood moved, seconded by Commissioner Don Wallace, the County Commission voted unanimously to post "NO LITTERING" signs on Tannehill Parkway.

Commissioner Bobby Miller moved, seconded by Commissioner Reginald Murray, the County Commission voted unanimously to authorize a 40-foot right-of-way on Garner Road, Nivens Road, and LaGrone Road.

Commissioner Bobby Miller's motion to provide a letter of commitment to Tuscaloosa Housing Authority related to the demolition and rebuilding of Rosedale Courts was seconded by Commissioner Reginald Murray. Following discussion, Commissioner Miller withdrew his motion. Commissioner Miller moved, seconded by Commissioner Murray, the County Commission voted unanimously to send a letter of commitment in the amount of \$1,000,000.00, as previously agreed, to Tuscaloosa Housing Authority.

Commissioner Reginald Murray's motion to authorize Sentell Engineering, Inc., to re-advertise for bids for the Culver Road Sanitary Sewer Project, seconded by Commissioner Bobby Miller, was approved on a three-to-one vote, with Commissioner Gary Youngblood casting the NAY vote.

There being no further business to come before the Tuscaloosa County Commission, the meeting adjourned to Wednesday, March 2, 2011.







Tuscaloosa, Alabama, 35401, for the purpose of receiving comments from interested persons concerning the issuance of the Bonds.

- 3. Tuscaloosa County is the governmental unit on behalf of which the Authority will issue the Bonds and in whose geographic jurisdiction the bond-financed facilities will be located.
- 4. The undersigned is the applicable elected representative, as defined in Section 147(f) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, to approve the issuance of the Bonds on behalf of Tuscaloosa County; the publication of the aforesaid Notice of Public Hearing constitutes reasonable public notice as required by said Section 147(f); the hearing conducted pursuant to said Notice constitutes the public hearing required by said Section 147(f); and the approval of the issuance of the Bonds granted by this certificate constitutes public approval as required by said Section 147(f).
- 5. Any interested person appearing at the hearing on February 9, 2011, was given an opportunity to make comments to the Authority on the proposed issuance of the Bonds, and the undersigned has considered such comments as may have been made with respect thereto.
- 6. There appears no reason why the undersigned should not approve the issuance of the Bonds.
- 7. The undersigned hereby approves the issuance by the Authority of the bonds and the financing program to be accomplished thereby, all in accordance with the applicable provisions of said Section 147(f).
