This being the date and hour to which the Tuscaloosa County Commission adjourned, the County Commission met pursuant to such adjournment with Probate Judge W. Hardy McCollum presiding as Chairman. The following members were present:

Commissioner Bobby Miller moved, seconded by Commissioner Reginald Murray, the County Commission voted unanimously to renew the county's contract with Pearce Trucking, Inc. for one additional year. The bid for the rental of dump trucks to be used as needed on various projects throughout the county was awarded on October 19, 2005, at a cost of \$70 per hour.

Commissioner Reginald Murray moved, seconded by Commissioner Don Wallace, the County Commission voted unanimously to approve payment to Burk-Kleinpeter, Inc. for the following invoices for engineering services:


There being no further business to come before the Tuscaloosa County Commission, the meeting adjourned to Wednesday, September 19, 2007.

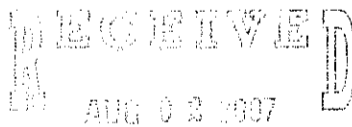



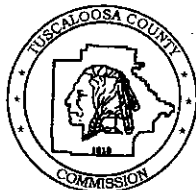

Gentlemen:

Last year's Budget included a study to establish service levels of staffing and workload for the Sheriff's Office to maintain adequate service to the citizens we both serve. Adequate is defined by the action this office is able to take to prevent crime or stop crime from occurring. Second is our obligation to respond in a timely manner to crimes that have occurred. Third, our obligation to the citizens we serve to investigate and resolve criminal complaints in a timely manner. Fourth is our responsibility to serve the court and its service whether civil or criminal. I believe we are failing because of the lack of personnel to provide these services.

In our attempt to provide adequate service we are endangering the lives of the men and women charged with that responsibility. I am here to ask for a motion and a vote on Phase II of our January proposal and a commitment to support Phase III next year. Upon completion of this proposal, a formula should be established allowing for additional personnel based on the population growth and calls for service within Tuscaloosa County to maintain adequate service.

Today, four shifts of ten deputies work twelve hour tours, seven days a week, 24 hours a day. We are the only county entity to provide seven day a week, 24 hour service. Currently two deputies are on extended Workmen's Comp and two are serving in the Military, allowing for an average of 8 deputies per patrol shift answering 11 calls per shift and responsible for a ratio of one deputy per 166 square miles.

This is not adequate service in my opinion and I ask you to make a motion and vote on Phase II of my proposal
