This being the date and hour to which the Tuscaloosa County Commission adjourned, the County Commission met pursuant to such adjournment with Probate Judge W. Hardy McCollum presiding as Chairman. The following members were present:

Gary Youngblood

Reginald Murray

Commissioner Bobby Miller moved, seconded by Commissioner Gary Youngblood, the County Commission voted unanimously to declare surplus the vehicles listed on the attached exhibit. These vehicles will be auctioned off by Southeast Auction, Inc., which is located south of Tuscaloosa on State Highway 69S.

Commissioner Don Wallace moved, seconded by Commissioner Gary Youngblood, the County Commission voted unanimously to award bids opened June 15, 2005, as follows:

CONSTRUCTION OF CALHOUN LANE, FOWLER DRIVE & 38th STREET
Vinson Trucking and Contracting

CONSTRUCTION OF DRY BRANCH LOOP AND SPENCER'S COVE ROAD
Tomlin Construction, LLC

BASE PROCESSING SHERMAN BOLTON AND FOLEY ROADS
S.T. Bunn Construction Co., Inc.

Commissioner Don Wallace moved, seconded by Commissioner Gary Youngblood, the County Commission voted unanimously to award the bid on construction of Elrod, Jackson Johnson, and Sunnybrook Roads to Vinson Trucking and Contracting as the low bidder meeting specifications. Other bidders were Tomlin Construciton, LLC and Racon, Inc. The bids were opened June 29, 2005.

Commissioner Don Wallace's motion to reject all bids for mowing services on county rights-of-way and to seek new bids requiring bidders to have a General Contractor's License failed for lack of a second. Three of the bids opened June 29, 2005, did not meet specifications. Two bidders, Cronan Construction and E&E Enterprises, did not have a General Contractor's License, and Fairchild Construction submitted a bid based on hourly rates rather than a lump sum (total) bid. The fourth bid exceeded one million dollars, whereas the other three bids were in the \$200,000 range.

Commissioner Reginald Murray's motion to reject all bids for mowing services on county rights-of-way and to enter into an agreement with Fairchild Construction to cut county rights-of-way one time failed for lack of a second.

Commissioner Bobby Miller's motion to reject all bids for mowing services on county rights-of-way and to seek new bids to be opened next Thursday, and authorize the County Engineer to award same, failed for lack of a second.

Upon being informed by County Attorney Robert Spence that a General Contractor's License is not a prerequisite for providing mowing services, the County Commission unanimously approved Commissioner Gary Youngblood's motion to waive the bid provision requiring a General Contractor's License and to award the bid for mowing services on county rights-of-way to the low bidder meeting all of the other bid requirements - Cronan Construction. The bids were opened June 29, 2005.

Commissioner Bobby Miller moved, seconded by Commissioner Reginald Murray, the County Commission voted unanimously to approve a General Fund project to pave the parking lot adjacent to the

football stadium and a 100 foot by 100 foot area that will be used as basketball and volleyball courts at Hillcrest High School.

Commissioner Gary Youngblood moved, seconded by Commissioner Reginald Murray, the County Commission voted unanimously to cut the rights-of-way on Tannehill Parkway and Shamblin Woods Road for the town of Lakeview. Lakeview will reimburse Tuscaloosa County for the expense incurred cutting these rights-of-way.

Commissioner Gary Youngblood moved, seconded by Commissioner Bobby Miller, the County Commission voted unanimously to authorize the County Engineer to fill abandoned septic tanks at 4019 16th Street N.E. and 1503 36th Avenue N.E. in Holt. According to Planning Director Farrington Snipes, the county agreed to fill all abandoned septic tanks as part of the CDBG sanitary sewer extension project in Holt.

Commissioner Don Wallace moved, seconded by Commissioner Bobby Miller, the County Commission voted unanimously to authorize the execution of a material option for earth at forty cents per cubic yard with Tedford Cannon of Berry, Alabama.

Commissioner Don Wallace moved, seconded by Commissioner Gary Youngblood, the County Commission voted unanimously to authorize the erection of STOP signs at the following locations:

3-WAY STOP SIGNS

Hickory Drive and Pecan Drive in Wood Estates
Cedarwood Avenue and Meadow Street in Kentuck Estates

4-WAY STOP SIGNS

Elderberry Lane and Cranberry Drive in Carrollwood Estates

Upon request from the Cottdale Little League Baseball Association, and upon motion by Commissioner Gary Youngblood, seconded by Commissioner Don Wallace, the County Commission voted unanimously to assist with the enlargement of the parking lot at Gordon Davis Park in Cottdale.

Commissioner Don Wallace moved, seconded by Commissioner Reginald Murray, the County Commission voted unanimously to vacate a portion of Harper Road and approximately one hundred feet of Olivewood Road in response to a petition for annexation from the City of Northport.

Commissioner Bobby Miller moved, seconded by Commissioner Don Wallace, the County Commission voted unanimously to approve the warrants issued to cover Tuscaloosa County's expenditures for the month of May, 2005.

Commissioner Bobby Miller moved, seconded by Commissioner Gary Youngblood, the County Commission voted unanimously to adopt a resolution resolving that retiring License Commissioner Lee A. Hallman be paid the maximum allowed by law for a supernumerary official with twenty-two years of service, or seventy-five (75) percent of his salary. The resolution further retained Mr. Hallman as the designated signatory on all accounts or official reports of the office of License Commissioner until a final exit audit of accounts is concluded, but not later than July 31, 2005.

Commissioner Don Wallace moved, seconded by Commissioner Bobby Miller, the County Commission voted unanimously to set the salary of the new License Commissioner, Jeffery Brown, at \$60,000 per year with a ten (10) percent increase at the end of year one and another ten (10) percent increase at the end of year two, providing Mr. Brown's work performance is satisfactory.

Upon recommendation of the Sheriff's Office, and upon motion by Commissioner Bobby Miller, seconded by Commissioner Reginald Murray, the County Commission voted unanimously to award the bid for one or more cameras and digital recorder systems to Buford's Locksmith. The bid was opened June 22, 2005.

Upon motion by Commissioner Bobby Miller, the County Commission instructed developer Jason Robertson to secure a permit from the City of Tuscaloosa to open-cut Maxwell Loop Road to facilitate the construction of a subdivision south of Maxwell Loop Road. The developer will provide a two year maintenance performance bond (\$25,000) to both the City of Tuscaloosa and Tuscaloosa County.

Mr. Bucky Walters, President of Merchant Marines, Vulcan Chapter in Birmingham, informed the County Commission that the directors of the Tuscaloosa Veterans Memorial Park have not responded to the County Commission's resolution adopted January 19, 2005, urging the placement of an appropriate plaque commemorating the service of the Merchant Marines during World War II at the Tuscaloosa Veterans Memorial Park located on McFarland Boulevard. The Vulcan Chapter has already secured the plaque.

Probate Judge W. Hardy McCollum asked the County Attorney to determine why the Directors of the Tuscaloosa Veterans Memorial Park have not responded to the commission's aforementioned resolution.

Commissioner Gary Youngblood moved, seconded by Commissioner Bobby Miller, the County Commission voted unanimously to authorize the County Engineering Department to get off county rights-of-way and determine if the county can solve Ms. Shelby Chandler's flooding problem. The Corps of Engineers and State Soil and Conservation Department have been unable to assist Ms. Chandler. Ms. Chandler's home is located at 6625 Keene's Mill Road, Cottondale, Alabama.

Commissioner Bobby Miller moved, seconded by Commissioner Reginald Murray, the County Commission voted unanimously to authorize the Tuscaloosa County Park and Recreation Authority to award bids on the dirt work and the moving of utilities for the multi-purpose athletic and community center to be constructed adjacent to the Taylorville Primary School at Hinton Park off of Alabama Highway 69 South, provided the bid does not exceed \$275,000.

Commissioner Reginald Murray moved, seconded by Commissioner Bobby Miller, the County Commission voted unanimously to authorize Probate Judge W. Hardy McCollum to execute a professional services agreement with Burk-Kleinpeter, Inc. Under this agreement, BKI will provide engineering services for constructing a new roadway between U.S. Hwy 82 and Tuscaloosa County Road No. 2. This project shall be referred to as The County Road 2 Connector Road Project.

Commissioner Reginald Murray moved, seconded by Commissioner Bobby Miller, the County Commission voted unanimously to return the designation of race back to Tuscaloosa County's personnel


records to assist the Civil Service Board and Personnel Department with a diverse population during the hiring process. At the June 18, 1997, County Commission meeting the Commission voted to discontinue keeping personnel records using race and gender as a criteria.


Commissioner Reginald Murray's motion, seconded by Commissioner Bobby Miller, to bring every department in compliance with the 1977 court order enjoining Tuscaloosa County to hire at least one black applicant for each three applicants hereafter hired in each department of Tuscaloosa County government (provided there be a qualified and interested black applicant then available for such employment) until such time that blacks constitute at least twenty percent of the employment force of such department, etc. was not voted on.




There being no further business to come before the Tuscaloosa County Commission, the meeting adjourned to Wednesday, August 3, 2005.

J U D G M E N T

In accordance with the findings of fact and conclusion of law contained in the Memorandum of Opinion filed concurrently herewith, it is ORDERED as follows:

1. As to the claims seeking injunctive relief for the class as a whole, this cause shall be maintained on behalf of a class consisting of all black persons who have job applications with Tuscaloosa County now actively pending with the Tuscaloosa Civil Service Commission or who may hereafter apply for employment by Tuscaloosa County agencies through the Tuscaloosa Civil Service Commission. Class action status is hereby denied, without prejudice, as to any other claims for relief on behalf of class members.

2. Those persons who now or hereafter constitute members, officers agents, servants, employees and attorneys of the Tuscaloosa County Commission or of the Tuscaloosa Civil Service Commission, and all other persons or agencies in active concert or participation with them who receive actual notice of this order are hereby ENJOINED:

(a) to hire at least one black applicant for each three applicants hereafter hired in each department of Tuscaloosa County government (provided there be a qualified and interested black applicant then available for such employment) until such time that blacks constitute at least 20% of the employment force of such department; and

(b) except as provided in (a), from failing or refusing to hire or refer for employment, or from discharging, or from otherwise discriminating against any individual with respect to his or her compensation, terms, condition, or privileges of employment with or by agencies of Tuscaloosa County, Alabama, because of such individual's race or color; and

(c) except as provided in (a), from limiting, segregating, or classifying employees of agencies of Tuscaloosa County, Alabama, or applicants for such employment, in any way which would deprive or tend to deprive any individual of such employment opportunities or otherwise adversely affect his or her status as such an employee because of such individual's race or color.

3. The Tuscaloosa Civil Service Commission is directed to maintain appropriate records whereby compliance with the foregoing injunction can be determined. In the event a hiring decision is made 7-9

by a department of Tuscaloosa County government contrary to the requirements of 2(a), the defendants are directed to disregard such hiring decision and, in such event, the Tuscaloosa Civil Service Commission is further empowered and directed to make a hiring decision for such department which is consonant with the requirements of 2(a).

4. The individual claims for relief of Marvin Avery are denied.

5. Costs are taxed against the defendants.
