

TUSCALOOSA COUNTY COMMISSION
MEETING

January 18, 2006

This being the date and hour to which the Tuscaloosa County Commission adjourned, the County Commission met pursuant to such adjournment with Probate Judge W. Hardy McCollum presiding as Chairman. The following members were present:

Commissioner Bobby Miller moved, seconded by Commissioner Reginald Murray, the County Commission voted unanimously to permit Southern Natural Gas Company to abandon and replace sections of gas lines at various locations in Tuscaloosa County, as described in the attached exhibit.

Commissioner Gary Youngblood moved, seconded by Commissioner Bobby Miller, the County Commission voted unanimously to grant Warrior River Water Authority a utility permit to open-cut a county road at 12978 Alpine Circle to lay a water line and install a water meter.

Commissioner Gary Youngblood moved, seconded by Commissioner Bobby Miller, the County Commission voted unanimously to grant Buhl, Elrod & Holman Water Authority a utility permit to open-cut Shelly Hughes Road at the Paul Mills Road intersection (house number 14314) to lay an access water line for new service.

Commissioner Don Wallace moved, seconded by Commissioner Gary Youngblood, the County Commission voted unanimously to adopt a resolution agreeing to enter into an agreement whereby Tuscaloosa County agrees to cooperate with the Alabama Department of Transportation in the construction of a 34 foot span AASHTO girder bridge (Relief Bridge No. 4) on Brownville Pike Road at the Sipsey River. Project Number BRZ-6300(205), TCP 63-94-99.

Commissioner Bobby Miller moved, seconded by Commissioner Gary Youngblood, the County Commission voted unanimously to declare the vehicles and air compressor listed on the attached exhibit as surplus to facilitate disposal of same.

Commissioner Bobby Miller moved, seconded by Commissioner Reginald Murray, the County Commission voted unanimously to depart from the order of business set forth in the official agenda to consider declaring the old desks, chairs, etc. in the basement of the courthouse as surplus.

Commissioner Gary Youngblood moved, seconded by Commissioner Bobby Miller, the County Commission voted unanimously to declare the old desks, chairs, etc. lined against the basement wall as surplus. This will facilitate disposal of this obsolete office furniture.

Upon motion by Commissioner Bobby Miller, the County Commission voted unanimously to table the following: (one) a request by Buhl, Elrod, & Holman Water Authority for payment in the amount of \$2,425.28 for relocating a water line on Jackson Johnson Road; and (two) a request by Englewood Hulls Water System for payment in the amount of \$35,379.46 for relocating a water line on H.B. Johnson Road.

Commissioner Bobby Miller moved, seconded by Commissioner Don Wallace, the County Commission voted unanimously to award the bid for construction of a speed table on Crabtree Road to Mallory Burkhalter Paving, Inc. The \$6,700 bid was opened December 21, 2005.

Probate Judge W. Hardy McCollum presented Tuscaloosa County Road Foreman James H. Snow a twenty-five year service pin and thanked him for his dedicated service to the citizens of Tuscaloosa County.

Commissioner Bobby Miller moved, seconded by Commissioner Gary Youngblood, the County Commission voted unanimously to approve the warrants issued to cover Tuscaloosa County expenditures for the month of November, 2005.


Commissioner Reginald Murray moved, seconded by Commissioner Gary Youngblood, the County Commission voted unanimously to authorize Probate Judge W. Hardy McCollum to purchase sixty (60) more election (voting) machines for Tuscaloosa County. These additional machines, which comply with the HELP AMERICA VOTE ACT, will cost close to \$6,000 each for a total expenditure of approximately \$361,500. The county should be reimbursed for a portion, if not all, of this expenditure from federal funds available through the Secretary of State (Alabama) Office.


Commissioner Reginald Murray moved, seconded by Commissioner Gary Youngblood, the County Commission voted three to one to appropriate an additional \$100,000 for the District Attorney's Office. These funds are being provided to cover a cash shortage in the District Attorney's Office caused by a decline in federal grants and a reduction of funds from the Worthless Check Unit. Commissioner Don Wallace's amendment to reduce the \$100,000 to \$50,000 failed for lack of a second. Probate Judge W. Hardy McCollum voted NAY; Commissioner Bobby Miller abstained.


Upon request from Mr. Tommy Belcher, and after determining that Tuscaloosa County road crews have worked Rifle Range Road in the past, Commissioner Gary Youngblood moved, seconded by Commissioner Bobby Miller, the County Commission voted unanimously to instruct the County Engineer to work Rifle Range Road from Hwy 216 to the end of the road at the mailbox located at the Judge James Mayfield house.


There being no further business to come before the Tuscaloosa County Commission, the meeting adjourned to Wednesday, February 1, 2006.

**RE: 2006 ABANDONMENT AND REPLACEMENT PROJECT
COUNTY PLANNING CONFLICTS CONSULTATION**

Dear Mr. Snipes:

Southern Natural Gas Company (Southern), is proposing to abandon and replace sections of its existing 22-inch Outside Diameter (OD) North Main Loop Line in Alabama. Construction is tentatively planned for August to November, 2006. The project is collectively known as the 2006 Abandonment and Replacement Project.

The proposed project will consist of abandoning in place a 10.91 mile section of pipeline in Tuscaloosa County, Alabama between mileposts (MPs) 260.74 and 271.65. Approximately one acre of land disturbance will occur at each end of the proposed abandonment. The pipe section will be cleaned, filled with nitrogen, capped, and abandoned in place. All abandonment activities will occur within Southern's existing, previously disturbed, and currently maintained right-of-way (ROW).

In addition, Southern proposes to remove a section of the previously abandoned 22-Inch OD North Main Loop Line from MP 265.29 to MP 271.65 (6.3 miles) and replace it with a new 24-inch OD 2nd North Main Line pipeline within the same ditch in Tuscaloosa County, Alabama. The section of pipe that crosses the North River at MP 269.45 will not be removed and will be abandoned in place. The pipe section will be cleaned, filled with nitrogen, capped, and abandoned in place. To minimize impacts, Southern proposes to cross the North River during construction of the 24-inch OD pipeline utilizing the horizontal directional drill technique.

ENSR is working with Southern to coordinate the regulatory approvals, permitting, field surveys, and FERC filing for the Project. We are consulting with the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers regarding issues related to wetland and waterbody permitting for the areas of abandonment. Biological field surveys have been performed to identify environmental features, including protected species and wetland and stream crossings along the existing pipeline corridor. Wetland delineations were conducted in accordance with the United States Corps of Engineers Wetland Delineation Method (1987 Manual), and boundaries have been recorded using GPS.

On behalf of Southern, we respectfully request the Tuscaloosa County Commission provide comment on the project in Tuscaloosa County, Alabama and provide any information regarding pending plans for development that may conflict with Southern's proposed project and
