This being the date and hour to which the Tuscaloosa County Commission adjourned, the County Commission met pursuant to such adjournment with Probate Judge W. Hardy McCollum presiding as Chairman. The following members were present:

Gary Youngblood
Bobby Miller
Reginald Murray

County Engineer Bobby Hagler notified the County Commission that Mallory Burkhalter Paving, Inc.'s bid on ten (10) speed tables met specifications and was awarded the bid, which was opened on February 1, 2006.

Commissioner Bobby Miller moved, seconded by Commissioner Gary Youngblood, the County Commission voted unanimously to concur with the County Engineer's selection of Thompson Tractor Company as the low bidder meeting specifications on two (2) rubber tire wheel loaders. The bids were opened on February 1, 2006.

Commissioner Bobby Miller moved, seconded by Commissioner Gary Youngblood, the County Commission voted unanimously to concur with the County Engineer's selection of Southland International Truck, Inc. as the low bidder meeting specifications on a 2006 model cab and chassis single axle truck equipped with a bituminous distributor. The bids were opened on February 1, 2006.

Commissioner Bobby Miller moved, seconded by Commissioner Gary Youngblood, the County Commission voted unanimously to reject

the bids opened February 1, 2006, for a 59" drum width vibratory asphalt compactor because of an error in the specifications.

Commissioner Gary Youngblood moved, seconded by Commissioner Reginald Murray, the County Commission voted unanimously to grant Citizens Water Service, Inc. a utility permit to open-cut Hi Road to run a three inch main into a new subdivision in Vance. The cut will be between lot 10315 and 10375.

Commissioner Gary Youngblood moved, seconded by Commissioner Reginald Murray, the County Commission voted unanimously to grant Coker Water Authority, Inc. a utility permit to open-cut Patton Place Spur at the intersection of Sunnybrook Road at Belair Estates to install a water line.

Commissioner Bobby Miller moved, seconded by Commissioner Don Wallace, the County Commission voted unanimously to authorize the execution of a "Municipal Right-of-way Permit" with the City of Tuscaloosa in which the city grants permission for the county to construct an additional traffic lane (turn lane) on Bear Creek Cut-off Road at the intersection of Bear Creek Road for approximately 375 linear feet.

Commissioner Gary Youngblood moved, seconded by Commissioner Reginald Murray, the County Commission voted unanimously to set ad valorem millage rates for the 2005-2006 tax year. The millage rates remain the same as the previous tax year of October 1, 2004, through September 30, 2005.

Commissioner Reginald Murray moved, seconded by Commissioner Bobby Miller, the County Commission voted unanimously to amend a motion unanimously passed on May 4, 2005, instructing County Attorney Robert Spence to amend Tuscaloosa County's subdivision regulations. Said amendment to the subdivision regulations will require that sewer lines be laid to the farthest outer edge, but within the county's legal rights-of-way, on county roads. The regulations amendment will also permit sewer lines to be laid in the center of streets in new subdivisions and will require

that sewer lines be stubbed out to each lot in the subdivision. Commissioner Murray's amendment to the foregoing motion will require developers to provide a letter of credit to Tuscaloosa County equal to ten percent of the utility construction cost.

Upon request by Stan Odom, Chief of the Coaling Volunteer Fire Department, and upon motion by Commissioner Gary Youngblood, seconded by Commissioner Don Wallace, the County Commission voted unanimously to provide to the Coaling Volunteer Fire Department a maximum of \$7,300 (approximately the cost of one hundred cubic yards of concrete) for a third volunteer fire station. This \$49,000 structure will be constructed on Keene's Mill Road near the Boy Scout Camp.

Commissioner Don Wallace moved, seconded by Commissioner Bobby Miller, the County Commission voted unanimously to approve the proposed 2006 District Development Projects for District I. The commission committed \$50,000 in District Development Funds to assist with the funding of the projects listed on the attached exhibit, which includes \$10,000 for the Westwood Elementary project in District IV.

Commissioner Gary Youngblood moved, seconded by Commissioner Bobby Miller, the County Commission voted unanimously to approve the proposed 2006 District Development Projects for District II. The commission committed \$50,000 in District Development Funds to assist with the funding of the projects listed on the attached exhibit.

Commissioner Bobby Miller moved, seconded by Commissioner Reginald Murray, the County Commission voted unanimously to approve the proposed 2006 District Development Projects for District III. The commission committed \$50,000 in District Development Funds to assist with the funding of the projects listed on the attached exhibit.

Commissioner Reginald Murray moved, seconded by Commissioner Bobby Miller, the County Commission voted unanimously to approve

the proposed 2006 District Development Projects for District IV. The commission committed \$50,000 in District Development Funds to assist with the funding of the projects listed on the attached exhibit. Commissioner Don Wallace committed \$10,000 from District I District Development Funds to bring the total committed for District IV projects to \$60,000.

Commissioner Bobby Miller moved, seconded by Commissioner Don Wallace, the County Commission voted unanimously to adopt a resolution approving the submission of an application for grant funds under the Justice Assistance Grant Program through the Bureau of Justice. This \$24,858 equipment grant requires no matching funds.



Commissioner Gary Youngblood moved, seconded by Commissioner Bobby Miller, the County Commission voted unanimously to enter into a "Road Maintenance Service Agreement" with the Town of Coaling. The county will maintain identified roadways within the town upon request, when equipment and personnel can reasonably be scheduled. Labor, equipment, material, and other costs incurred by the county pursuant to such request will be reimbursed by the Town of Coaling.


Commissioner Bobby Miller moved, seconded by Commissioner Gary Youngblood, the County Commission voted unanimously to enter into a "Contract for Law Enforcement Services" with the Town of Coaling. The purpose of this agreement is to provide Coaling and the citizens represented by Coaling with enhanced law enforcement services by the Tuscaloosa County Sheriff's Office. This agreement shall take effect on or about February 15, 2006, and continue until September 30, 2006; and will automatically renew on a fiscal year basis every October 1st unless otherwise terminated. 
There being no further business to come before the Tuscaloosa County Commission, the meeting adjourned to Wednesday, March 1, 2006.

In addition, Municipality shall pay for all requested overtime or required overtime at a rate of \$35.29 per hour, due by the 5th day of each month. These amounts reflect the cost to the County and the Sheriff of the anticipated services of one Deputy Sheriff. 8. These resources include, but are not limited to, patrol vehicles, insurance and other benefits, any and all equipment that is necessary for safety, investigative, management, supervisory, and dispatching needs. The County will have the right to review and evaluate service charges and rates on an annual basis based on the County's calculation of anticipated actual costs. Such anticipated cost increases will be added, if necessary, to each contract year beginning October 1, 2006, and for each subsequent fiscal year.
