This being the date and hour to which the Tuscaloosa County Commission adjourned, the County Commission met pursuant to such adjournment with Probate Judge W. Hardy McCollum presiding as Chairman. The following members were present:

Commissioner Reginald Murray moved, seconded by Commissioner Bobby Miller, the County Commission voted unanimously to post Romulus Church Road "NO TRUCKS".

Commissioner Reginald Murray moved, seconded by Commissioner Bobby Miller, the County Commission voted unanimously to construct two additional speed tables on 52nd Street.

Commissioner Bobby Miller moved, seconded by Commissioner Gary Youngblood, the County Commission voted unanimously to award the bid for mosquito control chemicals to Clarke Mosquito Control Products as the low bidder meeting specifications. The bids were opened April 5, 2006.

Commissioner Don Wallace moved, seconded by Commissioner Bobby Miller, the County Commission voted unanimously to authorize the execution of a contract with McGiffert & Associates LLC to provide the design and engineering work on Carrolls Creek Parkway.

Commissioner Bobby Miller moved, seconded by Commissioner Reginald Murray, the County Commission voted unanimously to declare two (2) 1999 Drott-Badgers surplus; one was Unit 173, serial number 99024, and the second was Unit 275, serial number 990106. The equipment will be consigned to "Iron Planet", a WEB site, in an attempt to sell same.

Commissioner Don Wallace moved, seconded by Commissioner Reginald Murray, the County Commission voted unanimously to grant Mr. Charles Bracknell a utility permit to open-cut Cedarbrook Drive at approximately three hundred and fifty feet west of the intersection of Rice Mine Road N.E. and Cedarbrook Drive. Mr. Bracknell is installing fifteen, twenty-four, and thirty inch storm sewer piping and concrete junction boxes during the construction of a car wash.

Commissioner Reginald Murray moved, seconded by Commissioner Gary Youngblood, the County Commission voted unanimously to depart from the order of business set forth in the official agenda to consider extending the county's rights-of-way mowing service contract.

Commissioner Reginald Murray moved, seconded by Commissioner Gary Youngblood, the County Commission voted unanimously to exercise the county's option to extend the contract with Cronan Construction for mowing services on county rights-of-way for one year. All contract terms will remain the same.

Commissioner Bobby Miller moved, seconded by Commissioner Reginald Murray, the County Commission voted unanimously to award the bid for silt fence - furnished and installed - to the low bidder meeting specifications. Bidding firms were as follows:

Mr. John Merrill, Public Relations Director for the Tuscaloosa County Board of Education, and Ms. Earnestine Giles, the premier special needs teacher in the State of Alabama and teacher at Hillcrest High School, presented the County Commission a plaque and

a certificate expressing the Tuscaloosa County Board of Education's appreciation for the Commission's continuous and on-going support for Hillcrest High School's Greenhouse Program.

The Greenhouse Program was developed by Ms. Earnestine Giles. The majority of the students that use the greenhouses are special needs students that may not make it academically in regular classrooms. The greenhouses serve as learning laboratories and will enable the students to learn vocational skills and possibly be gainfully employed.

Commissioner Reginald Murray moved, seconded by Commissioner Don Wallace, the County Commission voted unanimously to adopt a resolution approving the submission of an application for a 2006 COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT PROJECT requesting a portion of the \$1,170,558.12 needed to extend sanitary sewer services in the Culver Road/Johnson Road area to eliminate the use of poorly-functioning septic tanks. Tuscaloosa County is committing \$770,558.12 in the form of cash and in-kind match. Tuscaloosa County is proceeding with this application under the assumption that the City of Tuscaloosa will provide some of the matching funds because part of the project is in the city, and the city sewer system will gain one hundred and forty-one additional customers. The grant application process must proceed in order to meet the May 10th deadline for submission of 2006 CDBG applications.





The bids were opened April 5, 2006.


Commissioner Don Wallace's motion, seconded by Commissioner Reginald Murray, to appropriate \$270,000 to renovate Northside Baseball Park in District I and \$250,000 to renovate Kentuck Baseball Park and allocate another \$20,000 to PARA for administrative overhead in District IV immediately; and to appropriate \$270,000 each for Districts II and III to be included in the 2006-07 fiscal year budget, failed on a two-two tie vote. Commisisoner Gary Youngblood and Commissioner Bobby Miller cast the NAY votes.




There being no further business to come before the Tuscaloosa County Commission, the meeting adjourned to Wednesday, May 3, 2006.

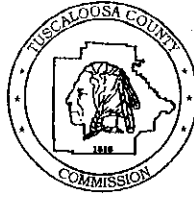

WHEREAS, the Tuscaloosa County Commission is eligible to apply for grant funds under the FY 2006 Community Development Block Grant Program as administered by the Alabama Department of Economic and Community Affairs; and


WHEREAS, two public hearings were held to solicit input from county residents regarding various proposed projects under the grant program; and

WHEREAS, upon review of the proposed projects, the determination has been made that there exists a need for the extension of sanitary sewer service in the Culver Road/Johnson Road area to eliminate the use of poorly-functioning septic tanks and to alleviate the potential for serious health threats in the project area through the provision of an adequate and acceptable means for the disposal and treatment of sanitary waste;


NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Tuscaloosa County Commission hereby approves the preparation and submission of an application for a 2006 Community Development Block Grant Project requesting a portion of the required funds for the extension of sanitary sewer into the aforementioned area to serve approximately 120 households at a total cost of approximately \$1,170,558.12 (grant funds and local matching funds);

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that \$770,558.12, in the form of cash and in-kind match, will be provided through the Tuscaloosa County Commission as a statement of local commitment to the project and that W. Hardy McCollum, Chairman, is hereby authorized to execute all required documents in conjunction with the submission of the project application.
