This being the date and hour to which the Tuscaloosa County Commission adjourned, the County Commission met pursuant to such adjournment with Probate Judge W. Hardy McCollum presiding as Chairman. The following members were present:

Commissioner Don Wallace moved, seconded by Commissioner Bobby Miller, the County Commission voted unanimously to grade the dirt road in Sunrise Estates Subdivision on an emergency basis. The road is in deplorable condition and is a safety hazard for emergency vehicles.

Commissioner Reginald Murray moved, seconded by Commissioner Bobby Miller, the County Commission voted unanimously to suspend the rules to consider joining the Gulf Coast Regional Fugitive Task Force.

Commissioner Reginald Murray moved, seconded by Commissioner Bobby Miller, the County Commission voted three to one to join the Gulf Coast Regional Fugitive Task Force; to assign two deputies

to the task force, and to create two additional deputy positions to replace these two positions. The taskforce, the sixth one created under legislation/grant co-sponsored by Alabama Senator Richard Shelby and Senator Thad Cochran of Mississippi, is the largest in terms of numbers and geographic area, covering Alabama and Mississippi. The deputies assigned to this task force will receive specialized U.S. Marshall training in tracking down sex offenders, drug and violent crime offenders, and will be deputized as Special Deputy United States Marshall. Tuscaloosa County will pay the salary of deputies assigned to this task force; the task force will pay for overtime and will provide them a vehicle. After eighteen months the two deputies, at the discretion of county officials, will rotate out and two other deputies will enter the task force for eighteen months. Commissioner Gary Youngblood cast the NAY vote.

Commissioner Bobby Miller moved, seconded by Commissioner Don Wallace, the County Commission voted unanimously to approve the warrants issued to cover Tuscaloosa County's expenditures for the month of September, 2006.


Commissioner Don Wallace moved, seconded by Commissioner Gary Youngblood, the County Commission voted unanimously to suspend the rules to consider submitting a grant application to the Office of Justice Programs within the Department of Justice.

Commissioner Don Wallace moved, seconded by Commissioner Gary Youngblood, the County Commission voted unanimously to adopt a resolution authorizing the submission of a grant application applying for funds up to \$300,000.00 under the Office of Justice Programs within the Department of Justice. This zero match grant will provide a new technology vest for deputies in the Sheriff's Office.






