Commissioner Stan Acker moved, seconded by Commissioner Reginald Murray, the County Commission voted unanimously to approve the minutes of August 4, 2021.

Commissioner Jerry Tingle moved, seconded by Commissioner Mark
C. Nelson, the County Commission voted unanimously to go into
executive session prior to the end of this meeting to discuss
contract negotiations and board appointments. The Commission will not
reconvene following the executive session.

Commissioner Stan Acker moved, seconded by Commissioner Jerry Tingle, the County Commission voted unanimously to adopt a resolution for the establishment of the Bane Family Cemetery (Grace Point Cemetery) off Prewitt Loop Road.







PROFESSIONAL CONSULTING AND PROJECT SERVICES AGREEMENT

For

AEMA/FEMA HMGP Application Development Tuscaloosa County Commission, Alabama Tornado Safe Room

(Agreement)

EnCompass360, Inc. will provide professional consulting and application development services related to Tuscaloosa County Commission, Alabama's HMGP Application for Submission, Review and Approval by AEMA and FEMA.

Between EnCompass360, Inc. And Tuscaloosa County Commission, Alabama

This Agreement, effective as of August 16, 2021, is entered into between EnCompass360, Inc. (hereinafter called "EC360"), and The Tuscaloosa County Commission, Alabama. (hereinafter called "TCC"), for the purpose of providing AEMA/FEMA HMGP professional consulting and application development services related to the submission, review, and approval by AEMA and FEMA – Phase 1.

This agreement for FEMA application development, submission, and monitoring, includes all architect, engineering, mapping/photography, budgeting, benefit cost analysis, required FEMA documentation, monitoring and Request for Information (RFIs) during AEMA/FEMA review and up to FEMA approval.

This agreement for professional services does not have a contingency clause and the scope of work and activities will be carried out consistent with FEMA laws, regulations, and eligibility guidelines. Therefore, this agreement is not contingent upon the issuance of a Presidential declaration or FEMA's approval or obligation of funds for this project.

EC360 is not employed by FEMA or Alabama Emergency Management Agency (AEMA).

1. EnCompass360 - Phase 1 Tasks

Project Tasks related to professional consulting and HMGP application development services for the submission, review, and approval by AEMA and FEMA – Phase 1.

- Professional Consulting and HMGP Application Development Phase 1
 - o Provide safe room solutions, options, and costs to be considered by client.

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EnCompass360, Inc.

- Prepare initial safe room design drawings and specs for FEMA review Certified Architect.
- Prepare Generator Sizing and Data Sheets by Certified Electrical Engineer.
- Perform Peer Review of Safe Room Design and Specs by 2nd Certified Architect
- Primary and Alternate locations as required by FEMA for safe room
- o Prepare Construction and Soft cost estimate for safe room budget
- Prepare Multiple Maps (Population Supported, FIRM, TOPO, QUAD, Street)
- o Prepare Site Photos
- o Prepare and Run Benefit Costs Analysis
- Prepare environmental and historical data and request for approval by Alabama SHPO, and for FEMA review and approval.
- o Include County Mitigation Plan and assure clients inclusion in that plan
- Prepare and Include Area Damage, Risk Assessment, and Historical Event Data
- Prepare all AEMA and FEMA Agreements for approval and execution
- o Prepare Preliminary Safe Room Maintenance and Operations Plan
- Input all data into AEMA Automated HMGP application system for client's signature and submission to AEMA and FEMA for review.
- Monitor and respond to any AEMA or FEMA request for information during project review for approval.
- Project and Grant Management Tasks related to the approved AEMA/FEMA HMGP project which includes Phase 2 Detailed Design/Specs, Bidding, Construction, and Project Closeout will be a separate agreement executed between EnCompass360 and TCC upon approval of this project by FEMA/AEMA.

2 EC360 Project Fee Payment for Phase 1

These fees cover cost(s) incurred during the development of this FEMA HMGP application, including submission, monitoring, responding to RFIs during the AEMA/FEMA review, but prior to the date of the grant award or final approval, and are identified as pre-award costs.

These pre-award cost(s) fees can be included in the project application for FEMA 75% reimbursement approval by FEMA.

FEMA has the option of approving or disapproving pre-award costs directly related to the development and submission of the HMGP application.

EnCompass360 Professional Services Fee Pre-Award HMGP Application Development Costs

- Pre-Award Application Development Fee includes all tasks identified in Phase 1 (See above tasks descriptions)
- EnCompass360's Pre-Award Application Development Fee will be \$65,000.
- Encompass360's Fee will be broken into \$32,500 due upon execution of agreement, and \$32,500 due upon submission of application to FEMA/AEMA for review.
- Pre-Award Application Development Fee is not contingent on FEMA approval or Obligation of funds.
- Pre-Award Application Development Fee will be due upon execution of this agreement by both parties.
- Payment(s) shall be made to EnCompass360, Inc., P.O. Box 1628, Gardendale, Alabama, 35071
- Delinquent payments shall bear interest at the rate of 18% annually.

3 Proprietary Information

During the term of this Agreement, EC360 and TCC shall exchange such proprietary technical and other information as is reasonably required for each to perform its obligations hereunder. EC360 and TCC each agree to keep in confidence and prevent the disclosure to any person(s) outside their respective organizations or any person(s) within their organizations not having a need to know, all information received from the other which is designated in writing or by appropriate stamp or legend to be of a proprietary nature and to use such information only in connection with their obligations under this Agreement provided, however, that neither party shall be liable for disclosure or use of such data if the same is:

- 3.1 In the public domain at the time of disclosure, or is subsequently made available to the general public without restriction by the disclosing party;
- 3.2 Known to the receiving party at the time of disclosure without restrictions on its use or independently developed by the receiving party, and there is adequate documentation to demonstrate either condition;
- 3.3 Used or disclosed inadvertently despite the exercise of the same degree of care that each party takes to preserve or safeguard its own proprietary information;

EnCompass360, Inc.

- 3.4 Used or disclosed with the prior written approval of the disclosing party;
- 3.5 Furnished by the disclosing party to the Client with "unlimited rights";
- 3.6 Disclosed without restriction to the receiving party from a source other than the disclosing party; or
- 3.7 Used or disclosed after a period of three (3) years after the date of receipt;

4. <u>Inventions and Patents</u>

Inventions conceived solely by employees of EC360 shall belong exclusively to EC360. Inventions conceived solely by employees of the TCC shall belong exclusively to the TCC. Inventions conceived jointly by the parties hereto in the course of work called for by this Agreement shall be subject to further agreement of the parties. This understanding is subject to modification as may be required by applicable regulations, or the terms of the prime contractor resultant subcontract between the parties. Except as stated in the preceding paragraph, nothing contained in this Agreement shall be deemed, by implication to grant any right or license in respect of any patents, inventions or technical information at any time owned by the other party.

5. Relationship

Nothing in this Agreement shall be deemed to constitute, create, give effect to, or otherwise recognize a joint venture, partnership, or formal business entity of any kind, and the rights and obligations of the parties shall be limited to those expressly set forth herein.

Nothing herein shall be construed as providing for the sharing of profits or losses arising out of the efforts of either or both of the parties, except as may be provided for in any resultant subcontract agreed to between the parties. The cooperation of the parties is for the purpose of complementing their respective capabilities to submit the highest quality product as possible.

6. Publicity and News Release

No releases shall be made to the news media or the general public relating to participation on the opportunity by either party without the prior written approval of the other party, which approval shall not be unreasonably withheld. The parties further agree that news releases made by either of them shall recognize the participation and contributions of the other party.

7. <u>Indemnity</u>

The employees of EC360 and TCC shall obey all pertinent rules and regulations of the other party while on the premises of the other party, including those relating to the safeguarding of classified information. Each party agrees to indemnify and save harmless the other party from and against all claims for:

- 7.1 Damage to, or loss of use of, the other party's property; and
- 7.2 Injury or death of any of the other party's employees or agents, to the extent any such damage, injury or death is caused by any act or omission to act, including negligence, of the indemnifying party's employees or agents in connection with performance under this Agreement.

8. Assignment

Neither this Agreement nor any interest herein may be assigned, in whole or in part, by either party without the prior written consent of the other party, except that, without securing such prior consent, either party shall have the right to assign this Agreement to any successor of such party by way at merger or consolidation or the acquisition of substantially all of the assets of such party relating to the subject matter of this Agreement; provided, however, that such successor shall expressly assume all of the obligations of such party/under this Agreement.

9. Entire Agreement

This Agreement constitutes the entire understanding and agreement of and between the parties with respect to the subject matter hereof, and supersedes all prior representations and agreements, verbal or written. It shall not be varied, except by an instrument in writing of subsequent date and duly executed by an authorized representative of each party. Paragraph headings herein are for convenience only and shall not limit in any way the scope or interpretation of any provision of this Agreement. The validity, construction, scope and performance of this Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of Alabama.

10. <u>Limitation of Liability</u>

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DIGITAL INFORMATION COOPERATIVE AGREEMENT

The Digital Information Cooperative Agreement (hereinafter referred to as Agreement) is entered into as of the 18thay of August, 2021 by and between the Tuscaloosa County Commission, (hereinafter referred to as COUNTY), and the Alabama Department of Transportation (ALDOT) (hereinafter jointly referred to as PARTIES).

RECITALS

WHEREAS, the COUNTY maintains a Geographic Information System that contains a significant variety of digital land information that is used in the daily operation of numerous departments supporting the constituents of Tuscaloosa County;

WHEREAS, the COUNTY has entered into a contract to acquire new digital orthophotography and updated mapping for the entire County.

WHEREAS, the ALDOT maintains information concerning the planning and maintenance of a statewide system of transportation corridors for the State of Alabama;

WHEREAS, it has been determined that each of the agencies maintain some information that is similar and overlapping;

WHEREAS, the ALDOT has a need for the digital ortho-photography and mapping for its use and that it is in the best interest of the constituents of these jurisdictions that a cooperative agreement be established to share the costs of development and maintenance of some of these similar data elements; and

NOW THEREFORE, the PARTIES hereto, in consideration of the mutual covenants and promises contained herein, and other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged, and intending to be legally bound, do hereby agree as:

Section 1. Contributions and Responsibilities

- 1.01 **Definitions.** As used herein the following terms shall have the meaning ascribed to them:
 - (a) "Specifications" shall mean those specifications required by the Alabama Department of Revenue's Property Tax Division "Specifications for Property Ownership Maps, GIS/Computer Assisted Property Tax Mapping and Aerial Photography (ADV-25)" document dated November 2004.
 - (b) "Data Set" shall mean the digital and non-digital information, databases, calculations, and products developed or placed to support the 2021 computerized mapping project.
- 1.02 The County has entered into a contract with G-Squared to acquire digital orthophotography and updated mapping for the County. The aerial photography and resulting data will be collected in accordance with the Alabama Department of Revenue's Property Tax

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Division "Specifications" Under the ALDOT State Planning and Research Annual Work Program, a Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) grant is being awarded to the COUNTY. The terms of the grant are as follows:

- (a) This agreement is for a federal grant in the amount of \$10,000 to be applied toward the completion of the 2021 photography and mapping project. Payment shall be made to the COUNTY within 90 days of receipt of the supporting documentation showing progress payments paid to the contractor.
- (b) This grant requires a 20% cost share to be paid by the COUNTY. ALDOT will be responsible for providing 80% (\$8,000) and the county will provide the remaining 20% (\$2,000) cost share toward the grant. The COUNTY will be responsible for funding the balance of the project cost.
- (c) The COUNTY shall provide the ALDOT a copy of the 2021 photography contract.
- (d) The COUNTY shall provide the ALDOT a copy of the "Data Set" and all deliverables generated from the County's 2021 photography contract.
- (e) As a member of the Alabama Geographic Information Executive Council, ALDOT shall make the resulting data available to other State and Federal Agencies for their business purposes.

This grant is listed under the Catalog of Federal Domestic Assistance (CFDA) 20.205 – Highway Research, Planning, and Construction. The use of Federal funds is pursuant to and in according with all regulations of the State of Alabama and the U. S. Department of Transportation. The County will reimburse Consultant for all eligible expenses upon submittal of invoices. All invoices will be accompanied by supporting documentation that includes all receipts for billable expenses and a project status report that shows the progress of the tasks detailed in the Scope of Work. All invoices submitted must be for work completed no later than September 30, 2021. The Alabama Department of Transportation will not be liable for any costs incurred after that date. The County has until close of business, October 15, 2021, to submit all paperwork pursuant to this Agreement. Failure to complete the action will nullify the contract. In the event that the final cost exceeds the estimated budget, the Alabama Department of Transportation will only be liable for the payment of the 80 percent Federal funds. The use of Federal funds is pursuant to and in according with all regulations of the State of Alabama and U.S. Department of Transportation as shown in Exhibits M and N, which are parts of this agreement.

Section 2. Term and Termination

2.01 Term. The term of this Agreement shall commence on the date of execution by the Governor of Alabama, and shall continue for one year.

2.02 Termination. Either party may terminate this Agreement by giving a thirty (30) day written notice. Either party may at any time terminate this Agreement in the event of insufficient appropriation of Federal funds. Upon termination of this Agreement for any reason whatsoever, no data will be required to be returned to any other party. The liability for payment of any unpaid fees or obligations shall continue until paid.

Section 3. Assignment. Neither this Agreement nor any of the rights or duties hereunder may be assigned or otherwise transferred in any way by any party hereto, voluntarily or involuntarily, by operation of law, or otherwise, without the prior written consent of the other party, which consent may be conditioned upon execution of an undertaking by the assignee pursuant to which the assignee agrees to assume the obligations of the assignor and to fulfill the assignor's duties hereunder, but such consent shall not otherwise be unreasonably withheld, conditioned or delayed.

<u>Section 4.</u> Force <u>Majeure</u>. No party is responsible for delays due to causes or occurrences beyond its control including, but not limited to, civil disobedience, acts of God, casualty or accident, war, labor disputes, or the like.

<u>Section 5</u>. <u>Successors and Assigns.</u> This Agreement will apply to, be binding in all respects upon, and inure to the benefit of the successors and permitted assigns of the parties.

<u>Section 6</u>. <u>No Third Parties Benefited</u>. This Agreement is made and entered into solely for the benefit of the represented parties, their successors and permitted assigns, and no other person or entity shall have any rights hereunder.

Section 7. Miscellaneous. This Agreement supersedes all prior agreements between the parties with respect to its subject matter and constitutes a complete and exclusive statement of the terms of the agreement between the parties with respect to its subject matter. This Agreement may not be amended except by a written agreement executed by the party to be charged with the amendment. If any provision of this Agreement is held invalid or unenforceable by any court of competent jurisdiction, the other provisions of this Agreement will remain in force and effect. Any provision of this Agreement held invalid or unenforceable only in part or degree will remain in full force and effect to the extent not held invalid or unenforceable. The captions used herein are for convenience and shall not control interpretation of the text.

<u>Section 8.</u> Counterparts. This Agreement may be executed in any number of counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original but all of which together shall constitute one and the same instrument.

<u>Section 9.</u> By entering into this Agreement, the COUNTY is not an agent of the STATE, its officers, employees, agents, or assigns. The COUNTY is an independent entity from the STATE and nothing in this Agreement creates an agency relationship between the parties.

<u>Section 10.</u> By signing this contract, the contracting parties affirm, for the duration of the Agreement, that they will not violate Federal immigration law or knowingly employ, hire for employment, or continue to employ an unauthorized alien within the State of Alabama. Furthermore, a contracting party found to be in violation of this provision shall be deemed in breach of the Agreement and shall be responsible for all damages resulting therefrom.

<u>Section 11.</u> By signing this Contract, the contracting parties affirm, for the duration of this agreement to remain in compliance with Act 2016-312. The Parties hereby agree that they are not currently engaged in, and will not engage in, the boycott of a person or entity based in or doing business with a jurisdiction with which this state can enjoy open trade.

Section 12. The COUNTY shall be responsible at all times for all of the work performed under this agreement and, as provided in Ala. Code § 11-93-2 (1975), the COUNTY shall indemnify and hold harmless the State of Alabama, the Alabama Department of Transportation, its officers, officials agents, servants, and employees.

Section 13. For all claims not subject to Ala. Code § 11-93-2 (1975), the COUNTY shall indemnify and hold harmless the State of Alabama, the Alabama Department of Transportation, its officers, officials, agents, servants, and employees from and against any and all damages, claims, loss, liabilities, attorney's fees or expense whatsoever or any amount paid in compromise thereof arising out of, connected with, or related to the work performed under this Agreement, (2) the provision of any services or expenditure of funds required, authorized, or undertaken by the COUNTY pursuant to the terms of this Agreement, or (3) misuse, misappropriation, misapplication, or misexpenditure of any source of funding, compensation or reimbursement by the COUNTY, its officers, officials, agents, servants, and employees.
