This being the date and hour to which the Tuscaloosa County Commission adjourned; the County Commission met pursuant to such adjournment with Probate Judge Rob Robertson presiding as Chairman. The following members were present:

Commissioner Mark C. Nelson moved, seconded by Commissioner Reginald Murray, the County Commission voted unanimously to approve the minutes of June 5, 2024.

Commissioner Stan Acker moved, seconded by Commissioner Mark C. Nelson, the County Commission voted unanimously to adopt a resolution approving and accepting the preliminary plat submission for Holmes Addition to Sherman Road, District I.

Commissioner Stan Acker moved, seconded by Commissioner Reginald Murray, the County Commission voted unanimously to adopt a resolution approving and accepting the preliminary plat submission for Resurvey of Lot 7 Blue Creek's 4th Addition to Camp Cherry Austin, District I.

Commissioner Mark C. Nelson's motion to authorize the Chair to execute an agreement with the Town of Coaling for animal control service provided by the Sheriff's Office was seconded by Commissioner Stan Acker. After discussion, Commissioner Mark C. Nelson amended the motion to add execution upon the Judge's review of the contract. Commissioner Stan Acker seconded the amendment and the motion as amended passed unanimously.

Commissioner Stan Acker moved, seconded by Commissioner Mark C. Nelson, the County Commission voted unanimously to fix the cost of demolition and file a lien in the amount of \$5,221.91 on 4605 21st St NE, District II, and remove the property from the Public Nuisance /Demolition list.

Commissioner Mark C. Nelson moved, seconded by Commissioner Stan Acker, the County Commission voted unanimously to approve a District III community development expenditure in the amount of \$14,500.00 to the Tuscaloosa County Board of Education to be used to repaint the awnings Maxwell Elementary.

Commissioner Mark C. Nelson moved, seconded by Commissioner Reginald Murray, the County Commission voted unanimously to approve a District III restricted ARPA funds allocation in the amount of \$300,000.00 for the Hillcrest High School Drainage - Ball Field Parking Lot project.

Commissioner Mark C. Nelson moved, seconded by Commissioner Reginald Murray, the County Commission voted unanimously to approve a District III restricted ARPA funds allocation in the amount of \$78,200.00 for the Bobby Miller Center Newt Hinton Park - Baseball Infield Renovations project.

Commissioner Reginald Murray moved, seconded by Commissioner Mark C. Nelson, the County Commission voted unanimously to approve the Culver Road Sewer Agreement to be sent to the City of Tuscaloosa for their approval.

Commissioner Reginald Murray moved, seconded by Commissioner Mark C. Nelson, the County Commission voted unanimously to depart from the order of business set forth in the official agenda to consider funding for the Fosters Farmers Market.

Commissioner Reginald Murray moved, seconded by Commissioner Mark C. Nelson, the County Commission voted unanimously to approve a District IV community development expenditure in the amount of \$1,470.05 for two (2) fans at the Fosters Farmers Market.

The Commission retired into Executive Session and did not reconvene.
