This being the date and hour to which the Tuscaloosa County Commission adjourned; the County Commission met pursuant to such adjournment with Probate Judge Ward D. "Rob" Robertson, III presiding as Chairman. The following members were present:

Commissioner Mark C. Nelson moved, seconded by Commissioner Stan Acker, the County Commission voted unanimously to approve the minutes of April 1, 2026.

Commissioner Reginald Murray moved, seconded by Commissioner Mark C. Nelson, the County Commission voted unanimously to adopt a resolution approving and accepting the preliminary plat submission for Emanuel Church Subdivision, one (1) lot on two and nine tenths (2.9) acres, no waivers, in District IV.

Commissioner Reginald Murray moved, seconded by Commissioner Mark C. Nelson, the County Commission voted unanimously to adopt a resolution approving and accepting the preliminary plat submission for Romulus Road Subdivision, three (3) lots on five (5) acres, no waivers, in District IV.

Scott Anders, County Engineer, advised the County Commission of the spring clean-up on April 18, 2026.

Commissioner Mark C. Nelson moved, seconded by Commissioner Stan Acker, the County Commission voted unanimously to award the lowest bid of nine for FEMA Project, Duncanville Community Safe Room to N.C. Morgan Construction Company in the amount of \$1,627,000.00, with \$266,000.00 being the County Commission's contribution to the project as presented by Grants Administrator, Lauren Benson.

Commissioner Mark C. Nelson moved, seconded by Commissioner Stan Acker, the County Commission voted unanimously to suspend the rules for budgetary matters due to the amount of \$266,000.00 exceeding the originally committed amount of \$200,000.00 local funding for FEMA Project, Duncanville Community Safe Room. Increasing the reserve allocation from \$200,000.00 to \$266,000.00 was unanimously approved by the Tuscaloosa County Commission.

Commissioner Stan Acker moved, seconded by Commissioner Mark C. Nelson, the County Commission voted unanimously to approve the warrants issued to cover Tuscaloosa County's expenditures for March 2026 in the amount of \$8,731,400.98, as presented by Chief Financial Officer April Hoffman.

In the absence of Commissioner Jerry Tingle, Commissioner Stan Acker moved, seconded by Commissioner Mark C. Nelson, the County voted unanimously to grant a 30-day extension to a property owner who is in the process of making repairs, as requested by Commissioner Jerry Tingle.

After discussion, Commissioner Reginald Murray moved, seconded by Commissioner Mark C. Nelson, the County voted unanimously to grant a 30-day extension to a property owner who is in the process of self-managed demolition of the structure.

Commissioner Mark C. Nelson moved, seconded by Commissioner Stan Acker, the County Commission voted unanimously to remove the property located at 1209 Plantation Road in District III from the list of structures deemed to be a public nuisance.

After discussion with Environmental Coordinator Brent Lollar, Commissioner Reginald Murray moved, seconded by Commissioner Mark C. Nelson, the County Commission voted unanimously to remove the property located at 3500 Culver Road in District IV from the list of structures deemed to be a public nuisance.

The Tuscaloosa County Commission was addressed by Lisa Wheeler and Mack Schultz of Earl Fields Cir who expressed their concerns related to an Airbnb located on Earl Fields Cir, referencing street parking that obstructed the road and private driveways, improper parking on the lawn, gun-related activity, and excessive noise. Captain Jeff Holloway of the Tuscaloosa County Sheriff's Office also addressed the Commission concerning this matter and indicated he would confer with Mrs. Wheeler and Mr. Schultz following the meeting to discuss potential solutions, and the Commission will be updated accordingly.

The Tuscaloosa County Commission was addressed by Thomas Gregory of Wesley Chapel Rd regarding the installation of new speed bumps on his roadway. He requested an explanation of the approval process that authorized their placement and expressed his belief that they do not meet necessary requirements. Judge Robertson noted that the Commission is aware of the matter and that it is currently under review.

There being no further business to come before the Tuscaloosa County Commission, the meeting adjourned to May 6, 2026.
